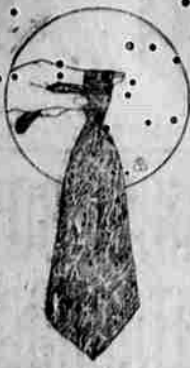

Arranging to Ship Trainload of Oldsmobiles From Factory to Oregon Soon.
