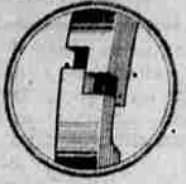

## Fine Harbor of Hamburg. is Now Almost Vacant

During the past week, the Observer has printed two letters from Karl J. Stackland, of Cove, who is now on an extended tour of Europe. The third letter of the series follows:

"HAMBURG, Germany, January 23, 1921—Editor, Observer.—Spending eight days in London and learning a great many things of Great Britain. Her many troubles on top of so many others, the dominating impression was that, with an Empire on which the sun never sets, come ceaseless worries that never end.

"By way of Harwich and the 'Hook' of Holland, I went to Amsterdam, across the land of thrift and prosperity, of canals, windmills and wooden shoes, and after a stop in each of the larger cities, ending with Rotterdam, and a second trip to Amsterdam and

The Hague, I concluded that little Holland had reaped an immense harvest from the great war, which they are now, under depressing times, hoarding with true Dutch economy.

"Rotterdam, on account of the war, has gained considerable shipping and is now one of the leading seaports of the world, and for bustle and activity, reminded me of some bustling American city.

Brussels is Small Paris.

"From there I went to Antwerp and found the people and city fairly recovered from the war, hopeful, and plainly making the best out of everything in reach; shipping up to about 35 per cent of pre-war times, and real poor people were always in evidence, not conspicuously so, however. Brussels went on a 'spree' after the four years of 'nightmare,' and so its ability, as before the war, was enjoying theatres and fine shops—a Paris on a smaller scale; while a large portion of the population is barely existing. From Brussels I went through Louvain, Leige, and a score of other battle-scarred places in a beautiful country, into Germany. Through Aachen, Ayr, la Chapelle, 'The Dove,' and many places on the 'highway' of the German armies and war equipment to Cologne, on the Rhine. Here I found far greater 'scars' from the war than in Belgium, not physical or scarcely material, as nearly every German face showed it, and although the city is fairly active and the people as a whole are living well, they look as though they had lost all and were living under the lash, sure enough. Nothing but black bread here, and baking shops and goods so abundant here. The only thing that was plentiful and cheap were the liquors—wines and beers which are universally

Business Men Are Hopeful.

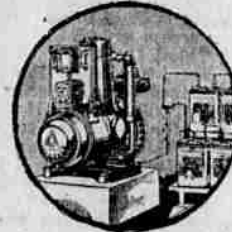
"From Cologne, I came down through the great industrial district of Düsseldorf, Essen and a score more of large manufacturing cities fairly active at the present time, through Bremen, on to Hamburg.

"Here, as was to be expected, I found a great change. The Harbor that seven years ago was the second or third in tonnage and importance in the world, is now nearly empty, and this means nearly everything to the city.

"However, I find businessmen in general hopeful for the future, counting much on the connection of the Harriman interests in the Hamburg-American Line, and in nearly every way the city has recovered a great deal in the past two years, and naturally is working and hoping for old conditions, but here, like in Cologne, most of the grown up people bear the whole history of the war written on their countenances. What this means in all its significance, is more than deplorable, it is a loss to all the world.
