LESSONS IN GOLF

Having don't wish the grip, stance and pivot, we will assume that you have those in mind, and know something about what you would do. The first club to be used from the tee is the driver. This club is a little more flexible than the brassie. The tee is also a little more straight and keeps the ball down, which is necessary to get a very long ball. The driver is very rarely used on the course, except on those occasions when the ball comes to rest on a tuft of grass and one is 200 yards from the green.

The average drive is about 200 yards, although there are a great many who get a much longer ball. The driver swing is a three-quarter swing. Some players make a complete circle, but the danger is over-swinging in doing this, consequently mistiming the swing. The brassie is much the same swing as the driver. The face of this club has a little loft to it and the shaft is a little stiffer. My advice to beginners has always been: Start out with the brassie first, as it is easier to get the ball away with the club. The beginner needs a little encouragement to start out.

I noticed two weeks ago that some of our players are getting the pivot very nicely, but are still unable to get the ball away regularly. Now, this is chiefly the cause of the incorrect wrist action. I think I have mentioned about the wrist action in my former lessons.

Now, it does not matter how good the pivot is, if the wrist is not working right, you cannot get the ball to rise. The great trouble is in turning the hand over too soon when the club comes in contact with the ball. In other words, you smother the ball. Whatever you do, do not push the body at it, but swing the arms and you will be surprised how the ball will go away with very little effort. I think I got one of our players to understand this a week ago Sunday. I feel sure that if he will keep it up, he will make one of our best players. One thing that I want to impress on every player, is never to swing as hard as you can. Always keep yourself under control and feel that you have put more strength in the swing. You will find that you are hitting and you have no control of distance or accuracy, and soon you will break up your wooden clubs. Remember, the long ball is never gotten through strength alone, but by the scientific golf stroke, and loose wrist. Never get discouraged. Some days you will be playing along nicely, then all at once it will go from you. But keep on with some of the Eastern Oregon pep and you will get your reward in due time. Consequently, you will be playing better than ever when you come back on your game again. There is not much to be said about the brassie. Only see that you do not attempt to use it on the fair way, unless you have a brassie lie. There are a great many matches lost owing to this mistake. Any time that you are in doubt as to the lie for a brassie, take your mid-iron, as you will be sure to get the ball away with the club and get a fair distance whilst with the brassie, you will often dab the shot. Always remember (all in tournament play) to be a successful golfer one must use his head and learn to take advantage of all these little things.

MANY WORKERS MAIMED IN OREGON DURING WAR

PORTLAND, Mar. 22.—As many Oregon men were maimed at work in industrial plants of the state during the war as were wounded overseas, according to Chas. B. Becker, chairman of the American Legion unemployment committee, who has issued a circular calling upon the state to co-operate with the committee in outlining a program for enforcing a program that would reduce accidents in industrial plants. Becker, declared he had been informed by an official of one industrial plant that "if the company had re-employed every man who had been maimed the entire force would be composed of maimed or crippled persons."

SWITCHING FACILITIES INTEREST MILTONITES

MILTON, Mar. 22.—In an effort to secure switching connections from the O-W. R. & N. railway to the Walla Walla Valley line, a petition

has been drawn and is being circulated among business men and merchants of Milton, such petition to be presented to the Public Service Commission of Oregon for their consideration.
