WOULD RETURN DELEGATION

PENDLETON, Mar. 22.—Roy W. Rittner, erstwhile president of the Oregon senate, made a plea for the return of the entire Umatilla county delegation, except himself, to the state legislature two years hence, as a conclusion of his digest of the past session before the Pendleton Rotary Club recently.

"A legislator is at sea and of little value to his constituency until he has been in Salem one year and has learned the ropes and become acquainted with the leaders," said Senator Rittner.

Umatilla's representatives, Miller, Sloan and Woodson, and her joint senator, Colon R. Eberhard, of La Grande, were praised highly by the president of the upper body, who told the Rotarians that he does not expect to become a candidate for reelection to the state legislature.

Rittner gave the club an insight into the workings of the legislature upon the important subjects of re-apportionment, tax conservatism, the road situation, Port of Portland bills, Senate Bill 123, for more equitable gradage of grain, hydro-electric power, and the bonus.

The speaker stated his position firmly in favor of the bonus for service men, saying: "Four years ago the people of this state put up a big undertaking before the young men of Oregon, and they came through magnificently; I am wondering if these same people will come through June 7 and give these boys what they are now asking for."
