STATE PLANT WILL REOPEN

LIMESTONE PLANT IS TO OPEN
EARLY IN JUNE.

Oregon Farmers Can Get Supply of
Ground Product for Use in Summer
and Fall Sowing.

The Oregon State Lime plant will renew operations early in June, reports Dr. A. B. Cordley, dean of agriculture at the state college and secretary of the state lime board. Farmers will be able to get their supply for summer and fall sowing at production cost plus freight from the plant at Gold Hill to their terminal.

This plant was operated for four years, during which it gave the farmers a chance to get agricultural lime at low rates. Its working capital was limited to \$32,000, and when labor costs mounted abnormally it was forced to shut down. The recent session of the legislature appropriated \$10,000 working capital, which with the return of labor costs to normal will enable the management to run to capacity.

Inspection of the quarry and plant by Dean Cordley and Benton Powers, president of the state plant, showed that it would not be feasible to start operations early enough to supply lime for spring applications.

The state plant quarry has an unlimited supply of 87 per cent carbonate of lime material. The product must be sold for cash in advance. Best shipping rates call for orders of 30,40 or 50 ton lots. It is thought that smaller orders may be accepted and filled in sacks, but that the cost will be too high for agricultural use. The experiment station has found that most soil responds to lime, especially when used with legumes. It recommends that where favorable results have not been proved only enough limestone for experimental uses be ordered.

WASHINGTON, D. C., Mar. 29.—The average price of plowland per acre in the United States decreased about 7 per cent during the past year, according to a report just issued by the United States Department of Agriculture. The average value of plowland per acre on March 1 of this year was \$83.78, as compared to \$90.01 in 1920, and \$74.31 in 1919. The statisticians of the department attribute the decline to the reduction in the prices of crops.

The report shows that the heaviest drop in the price of land is in the Southern States where cotton is the principal crop. In some sections of these states there has been a decline of 30 per cent in the price of plowland during the year. The average price of plowland in Georgia this year is \$36 per acre, while last year it was \$46—a drop of about 22 per cent. The average in South Carolina last year was \$61, while this year it is \$50—a drop of 20 per cent.

Probably the greatest drop in any one state was in Kentucky, and is attributed to the decline in the price of tobacco. In 1920, the average price of plowland in this state was \$70 per acre, while this year it is \$53. This is a decline of approximately 24 per cent.

Iowa is the state having the highest price of plowland per acre. The report shows that it is valued at \$200 this year, as compared with \$219 last year—a decline of about 9 per cent. Illinois ranks second in the value of plowland, according to the report, the price per acre being \$157. In Alabama and Mississippi the average price of plowland per acre is \$26.

The western states show the least decline in prices of land, and in the case of California, Oregon and Colorado there is a slight increase over last year. Plowland in California was valued at \$130 an acre last year, while this year the average is \$135.

The report shows that there was a rapid increase in the price of land from 1917 to 1920, when the highest price was reached. The decline during the past year is not as great as the increase from 1919 to 1920. Land prices are still higher than any year preceding 1920.

PLOWLAND PRICE IS DECREASING

DURING PAST YEAR, PRICE VALUE DECREASED 7 PER CENT

Average Price of Plowland Per Acre on March 1 Was \$83.78, Compared to \$90.01 in 1920.

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WASHINGTON, D. C., Mar. 29.—The Marine Corps was the first branch of the service to lift the temporary ban on recruiting, when it was announced today that applicants without previous service would be accepted. For the past two months recruiting for the Corps has been limited to re-enlisted Marines only.

Major General Lejeune directs recruiting officers to accept men for either three or four years, the two-year enlistment period being abolished. Physical, moral and mental standards are to be kept as high as possible, and no man who is less than 20 years old, 65 inches in height, and weighs less than 130 pounds is to be accepted. The total strength of the Marine Corps, when general recruiting ceased last January, was approximately 22,000. It is now slightly under that figure.
