## GETTING DATA FOR TAXATION

### LOVELL COMES FROM SALEM TO SECURE REALTY TRANSACTIONS

Desire To Get, At First Hand, Actual Values Existing on Property Prompts His Action.

With a belief that the only way to arrive at proper valuations of property for taxation purposes is to visit the different counties and, from the records, ascertain what property has been changing hands for in dollars and cents, Frank Lovell, of the state tax department, is staying in La Grande for a short time while he inspects the records at the court house.

Mr. Lovell is one of the state's most substantial men in that he handles the department, not as though it belonged to him personally, but with a full understanding that it is the people's work he is doing. No man commands higher respect of the general public and legislators than does this gentleman, who first knows what he is doing and, secondly, always tries to fulfill his obligations to the state.

He stated today that the figures given in deeds of record hardly represent proper values, but if one will examine the revenue stamps a fair idea of the value can be ascertained. Armed with all this information he will proceed to Salem and begin work on establishing a proper valuation for taxation purposes the coming year.

## IMBLES WANTS COWS TESTED

### FARMERS LIST MANY ANIMALS FOR TESTING.

#### Progressive Spirit Shown at Branch Farm Bureau Meeting—High Wheat Yield Reported.

At the meeting of the farm bureau branch at Imbler last evening the tuberculosis inspection work was discussed and 79 cows were listed for inspection. Much enthusiasm was shown by the farmers for the testing and an effort will be made to have all the cows in the district, which is around the 150 mark, tested when the extension specialist comes to Union county. This will probably be within three weeks.

Another topic that was given much time last night was that of using Washington Hybrid 128 wheat here. J. A. Gaskill, who irrigates his land, reported a yield of over 60 bushels per acre. He stated that his experience is that it is a much better yielder than Forty-fold, which is generally considered the best winter wheat here. A large number of farmers are putting in the hybrid this year and the yield per acre in the Imbler section should be much increased.

Ed. Reynolds, who is vice-president of the farm bureau and an important factor in the state fair, being a member of the state board, and one of the members of the county fair board, talked over a possible county fair for Union county with the Imbler farmers. The sentiment of the farmers was strongly in favor of a county fair this fall.

Several other matters were discussed during the evening. A farm bureau bulletin board will be erected in the town, according to a decision reached last night, on which farm bureau announcements will be made.

Poultry raising is another subject that brought out much interest last evening. A demonstration will soon be held to teach the poultry owners the best methods of weeding out the star boarders.

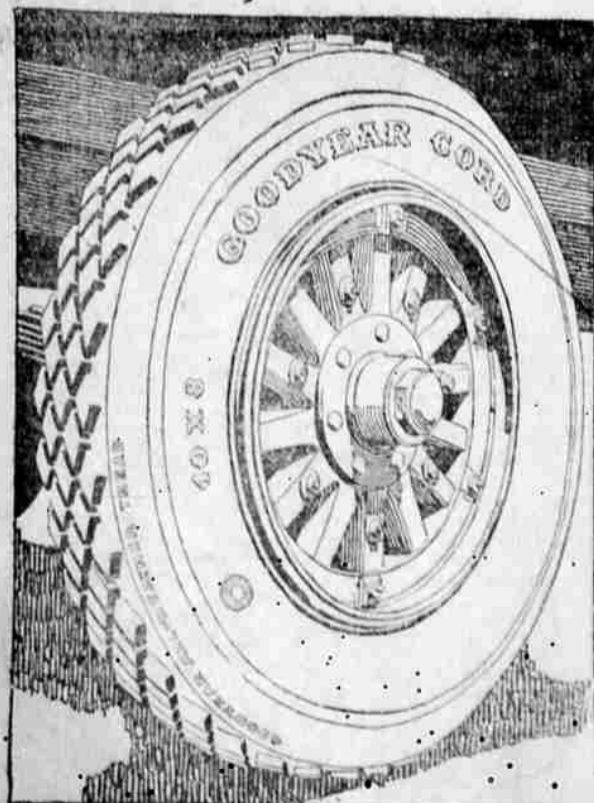
