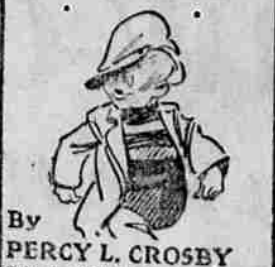

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ADDITIONAL IMPROVEMENTS

MORE PROPERTY OWNERS ASK FOR SIDEWALKS.

Several Petitions for Sidewalks Heard At Commission Meeting and Wider Roadway Is Wanted.

Street improvement work was again discussed at the meeting of the city commission yesterday evening. Several weeks ago an improvement district was created for the purpose of grading and macadamizing Oak street between O and Spring streets, the macadam to be 24 feet in width. Last night K. W. Lynch appeared as spokesman for the property owners and announced that they had decided that they want the paving full width, 40 feet, rather than having their curbs lines not in conformance with the curbs below Spring street where the street is 40 feet wide.

The commissioners told Mr. Lynch and J. G. Holm, who was also present in the matter, that as soon as a modified petition was presented the commission the change would be made.

A petition for cement sidewalks on the south side of W avenue between Spruce and Greenwood was granted but no improvement district was created for this improvement. The petitioners were Everett E. Walker, F. R. Lee and J. W. Knowles. Judge Knowles signed the petition as agent for eastern holders of four lots. Mrs. Hattie Campbell, of Pendleton, owns two lots in this district, but her signature was not on the petition.

Owners of 7 lots on U avenue between Fir and Greenwood, asking for cement sidewalks on the north side of the street presented a petition but the petition was referred back to them for further signatures. There

MEASLES IS LATEST IN CONTAGIOUS DISEASE LINE

Smallpox and scarlet fever are almost a thing of the past, at least so far as new cases here are concerned. However, measles is now showing itself in La Grande and yesterday the police department stated that about 25 cases had been placed under quarantine during the past few days.

The police are kept busy placing the white quarantine flags but those quarantined aren't quite so unfortunate as those who had to stay in under the yellow and red flags. The quarantine in measles cases isn't so strict and no tab is kept on the cases by the police so that doctors can release their patients just as soon as danger is past.

There still remain 15 smallpox quarantines and 6 scarlet fever cases in the city.

Given Value by Electric Furnace.
There are many valuable metals which we could not know in their pure form if it were not for the electric furnace. This remark applies particularly to the newly discovered metals, such as tantalum (used for pen points, because it will not corrode), chromium (which hardens steel), uranium (for radium), niobium (for giving a fine blue to pottery glazes), vanadium (for gold bronze) and selenium, the oxide of which gives a beautiful ruby color to glass, for radium and other signal lights.

Fourteenth-Century Playing Cards.
The playing cards of the fourteenth century differ materially from the pack in use today. The Venetian pack, for example, consisted of 78 cards—32 of them marked with emblems of various kinds and 56 with numerals, divided in four suits of 14 cards each.
