NORTH POWDER WOMAN ALSO IN CUSTODY.

Federal Officials Hold Couple, Said to Have Left Here Last December.

BAKERSFIELD, Cal., April 5.—Arthur J. Blum, a railroad switchman, was held here Saturday for federal authorities on a charge of violating the Mann act. Blum, it is explained, brought Miss Margery Cline, of Portland, Or., to this city. He was trailed from here to San Pedro and the Imperial valley. Later he was overtaken in the oil fields here, where he had obtained work.

PORTLAND, April 5.—The arrest of Arthur J. Blum at Bakersfield, Cal., was brought about by information furnished by local department of justice officials. No court action has been taken here, so prosecution will be had in California. Local records show the woman mentioned as Miss Margery Cline, of Portland, to be Mrs. J. D. (Nellie) Waldrop, of Medical Springs, Or., a small town near La Grande. About December 23, 1920, Blum, who was an employee of the O.-W. R. & N. company, is said to have taken the woman to a dance at La Grande. Shortly after that time they are said to have left for Portland by train. The trip from here to San Pedro was made by boat. Mrs. Waldrop is reported to have deserted her four-weeks-old child to travel with Blum. The child is being cared for by the woman's parents.
