NEW OFFICERS ARE ELECTED

The brotherhood of the Presbyterian church met last night at the home of Mr. O. L. MacDowell. Mr. John Hodgins gave an interesting talk on the work of the early Church Fathers from the writings of the great Church historian Eusebius of Caesarea, who lived and wrote during the 3rd century.

The officers for the next year were elected and are as follows: President, Lee Reynolds; vice-president, E. A. McEasham; secretary-treasurer, Oscar Porsch. Officers were elected at this time that they might have opportunity to plan the work for the coming year during the summer months when there are no regular meetings. The next meeting will be a joint meeting with the Men's Club of the M. E. church, the latter part of this month.

HEADQUARTERS TO BE HERE

La Grande is to be the headquarters for a northwest distributing agency, the territory to cover Oregon and Washington with LaGrande as headquarters. Dr. W. S. Lefroy who has been practicing suggestive therapeutics in this city for some little time, has retired from that profession and taken over the general agency for the Lightning Calculator Adding machine, a late and simple device for rapid calculation. While Dr. Lefroy will make his headquarters here, he naturally will be out in the territory a good deal, establishing agencies and looking after the affairs of his company.

"I see no reason why we shouldn't make La Grande my headquarters," said Dr. Lefroy in making his announcement today, "because it is certainly the commercial center of Eastern Oregon and I like the place and the people."

MORE PAVING IS DECIDED ON BY CITY COMMISSION

Oak street between O and Spring streets will be macadamized its full width, 40 feet, according to a petition granted by the city commissioners last evening. Previously a petition for 24 feet of macadamizing had been granted and the property owners decided that the full width is much more desirable. Standard grade will be established on the street and curbing put in. The petition was signed by owners of 18 out of 24 lots on the street.

A petition for a cement sidewalk along U avenue between Fir and Greenwood was also granted. This petition was first presented at last week's meeting of the commissioners but, owing to an insufficient number of signers, was referred back to the property owners. Ten of 13 lots were represented in the signatures presented last evening.

Several property owners on X avenue were at the meeting and voiced opposition to the condition of the street they live on. The commission explained that it was only too willing to improve that street if the owners would present a petition asking the improvement. One of the complainants informed the commission that sticks are stuck in the mud as warning larks there and that the street has practically been impassable all winter.

A resolution creating an improvement district for putting a cement sidewalk along the north side of W avenue from Spruce to Greenwood was adopted.

MANY PAYING WATER RENT

The report of the city manager for the week ending April 2 shows that the first two days of the month brought in over \$750 a day in water rentals, the total collected on those days being \$1,531.69. Other collections brought the total receipts of the treasurer's office to \$3,192.41, the disbursements during the week being \$782.87.

Pound fees and fines collected by the police department during the week amounted to \$13. Eight arrests were made during the week and all were convicted. The department quarantined 7 houses and released 9 houses from quarantine, the report states.

A fire occurred on April 2, according to the report of the fire department submitted to the city manager. A loss of \$10 was done to the building, which is located at 1606 Washington avenue, the department using 35 gallons of chemical, and 25 minutes elapsing between the sounding of the alarm and the recall. Eleven volunteers responded to the call.

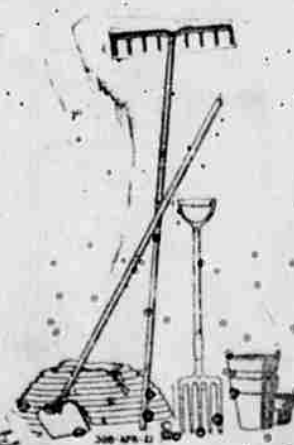
