# HOSPITAL DAY NATIONAL EVENT

There are "Fire Prevention" and other days, and even a "Be Kind to Animals Week," but until now no organized work has been made to tell of the work of the 8,000 hospitals of the United States and Canada in caring for the sick and unfortunate, none of whom is turned away if there is a bed to spare.

Hospitals, however, are to observe the first National Hospital Day on May 12, the 10th anniversary of the birth of Florence Nightingale, pioneer in modern hospital and nursing methods, with a program similar to that followed by other institutions throughout America. An inspection of the hospital and training school will be featured in many localities so that the people may see for themselves what the institutions are doing for their sick or injured fellow citizens and how the young women in the nurses' schools are equipped for their great profession.

President Harding, governors of states, and officers of corresponding rank in Canada are to be asked to proclaim National Hospital Day, including in their proclamation some reference to the work that is being done in the institutions housing the thousands of sick and wounded ex-service men.

The main object of National Hospital Day is to make the public better acquainted with its hospitals. Each hospital is to arrange its own program, with the general direction of the day in the hands of the National Hospital Day committee, 537 South Dearborn street, Chicago. Matthew O. ## DRAGER COMPANY SHIPS PRUNES TO GERMANY

SALEM, Apr. 9.—The largest deal in prunes of this season and the largest single shipment ever made from the Northwest, has been concluded by W. F. Drager, of the Drager Fruit company of Salem, for export abroad. Approximately 1,450,000 pounds of Oregon, Washington Italian prunes are being shipped to Germany, having been purchased within the past two weeks by the Drager Fruit company. Of this quantity 1,025,000 pounds were purchased from the Oregon

Growers' cooperative association and 225,000 pounds from the Puget Sound Prunes Growers' association. The prunes have been sold to Germany and will be shipped during the present month by steamer from Seattle. The sizes represented in this sale are 70-80, 80-90, 90-100, and 100-120. While the prices for these prunes are low, it is practically a clean-up of these sizes in the Northwest.
