CLEAN-UP WEEK IS UNDER WAY

Clean-up week is being held in by a large number of residents and already many of the streets and other thoroughfares can be seen lined up along the streets waiting until the city's teams come around Saturday to haul them away.

An effort is being made this week to make clean-up work more effective than ever and city officials, members of the Neighborhood club and the Red Cross are co-operating in seeing that all rubbish is cleared out of yards behind the city during the week and that which is burnable burned, and the other piled up in front of the houses along the street, where it can be easily hauled on the wagons when they call.
