METHODISTS OF CORVALLIS WILL BUILD NEW CHURCH

CORVALLIS, Apr. 12.—The Methodists will build a \$100,000 church. The official board of the church met last week and pledged the local congregation to \$50,000. Ground for the edifice will be broken early next year, and if building conditions are at all favorable the new church will be completed and furnished ready for occupancy by the time College opens in September of next year. The site will be the plot 200 feet long facing the College campus on Monroe street between 11th and 12th streets and extending north 100 feet. The building, plans for which have been submitted by church architects sent here from Chicago especially by the Church Board of Architects, will be the last word in meeting the requirements of a college community.
