PENDLETON, Apr. 12.—Six men were released by Manager Nick Williams of the Moose Jaw club here yesterday. The men who are passed along include two pitchers, Walter and Heim; two infielders, Clark, who plays the keystone, and Foffler, a third sacker; and two outfielders, Hopkins, who led the batting list in Sunday's game here, and Slagie. The squad was strengthened in numbers, at least, by the arrival of Bicky Williams, formerly an O. A. C. man, and later a player with Tacoma. He is a pitcher.

The club will leave Pendleton Wednesday morning, which will mark the conclusion of the training season here. They will play Dayton Wednesday, Pomeroy Thursday and from there they will go to Lewiston, where two games will be played Saturday and Sunday.

To Jettison Skins.

There are two simple ways of softening leather and raw skins. One is to rub in thoroughly neat's-foot oil. The other is to dissolve three ounces of alum, seven ounces of salt and one and one-half ounces saleratus in sufficient hot water to saturate the skin. When cool enough not to scald the hands soak the skin in it for 12 hours; wring out and hang up to dry. When dry repeat this operation two or three times until the skin is sufficiently soft.

Ambergia.

For many hundreds of years ambergis has been employed in sacerdotal rites of the church, and with fragrant gums it was formerly burned in the apartments of royalty. To some extent it was used as a medicine and as a flavoring for certain dishes. Nowadays ambergis is utilized almost exclusively in the manufacture of perfumes and the preparation of fine scents being first converted into a tincture by dissolution in alcohol.

Smoke as a Lightning Rod.
