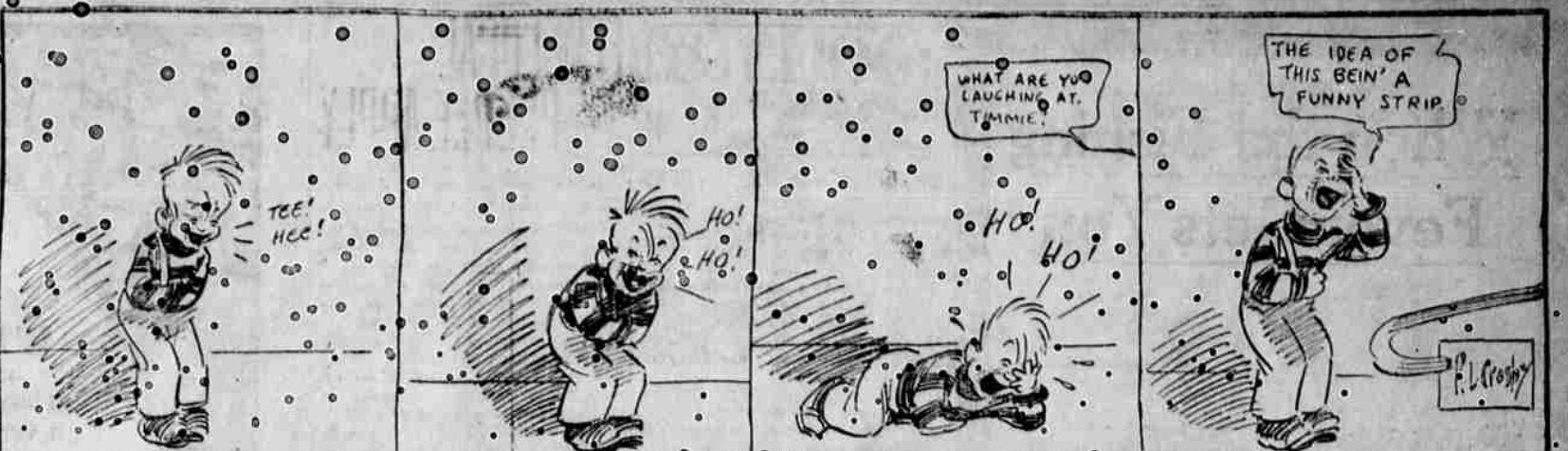

What is Home without a Garden?

Summer Squashes and Marrows

Summer squashes do not make much of a hit with a great many people as an article of diet because as they have been served there has been too much uncertainty as to whether to try to eat or drink them, the general impression on the palate being soft and wet.

Summer squashes do seem to have a tendency to dissolve when merely boiled and it takes some skill to secure them in sufficient solid form to serve, yet the squash must be eaten when it is young or it is of little value.

If it is boiled it should be well drained to get rid of part of the general wateriness, but it may be cooked in substantial form so that its real delicacy may be appreciated and that is by trying in much the same manner as egg plant. Cooked in this manner, the summer squash is a fine vegetable. Vegetable marrows fried are likewise a delicacy that is bound to become more popular as people become better acquainted with it.

The method of frying summer squash and marrows is this: Cut the vegetable into half-inch-thick slices or little less. Dip them in milk in which an egg has been beaten, then roll in crumbs and fry in deep fat or enough fat in the skillet so there will be no danger of their burning on. Turn them with a spatula or pancake turner.

Swiss Chard

For very small gardens, it is useless to attempt to grow spinach enough to make it worth while, because it takes so much of it to make enough to cook. Also the season is so short. If there is plenty of room it is the finest early "greens" that can be grown. But if the small gardener wants greens and plenty of them, a short row of Swiss chard will furnish an abundance all summer.

The chard is a beet that doesn't heat it to root, but confines all its energies to top. The leaves are very light green, often much crinkled, and there are heavy mid-ribs like celery stalks. The entire leaf, rich and all, may be cooked for greens, but the dish is more appetizing in appearance if the ribs are left out. They are sometimes cooked separately and served with butter sauce but are rather tasteless unless cooked with something to help bring out the flavor.

The Swiss chard will grow in almost any soil or location and when the leaves are cut off more will grow and the leaves from only a few healthy chards will make a big panful of material for greens. In fact, it is difficult to keep the chard used up if a very extensive planting is made.

It has proved an ideal vegetable for a small city garden and is quite as appetizing as spinach. This vegetable is becoming more popular

every year. It has been on the market for many years but is beginning to receive more general recognition than ever before.

The caper of commerce, which is the flower bud of an East Indian tree or bush, pickled in vinegar, the inevitable accompaniment of boiled mutton, is an expensive luxury these times, but anybody can grow his own capers and have a spicy little pickle at the same time.

Nasturtium seeds furnish the material. Here is a combination of flower and vegetable, worth having. Pick the seeds before they have turned woody. They usually grow in pairs and when they are ripe fall off the vine. Pick them while they still cling fast to the stems. Drop them into a bottle or glass half filled with vinegar and when they come to the top it is time to remove them. Boil them in fresh vinegar, and bottle them in the liquid, seal them up, and there are capers for winter use. They may also be used as a relish in salads with excellent results.

The Blue Lace Flower

There is much heralding of the "Blue Lace Flower" this spring and this old annual which has been neglected and little known is deserving of much praise. Quietly it has been hidden away under the non-committal title of *Didiscus Coeruleus* or sometimes known as *Trachymen coeruleus*. However, blue lace flower is a vastly better name for a

garden plant than the lengthy scientific names. Despite the fact that it is by no means a new flower, this Australian annual is worth a place in any garden for the rarity of its color and the delicacy of its bloom, the color being an azure blue and the cluster of tiny flowers arranged in a flat topped circle from one and a half to two inches in diameter is a beautiful subject for a bouquet, a few of the lace clusters with a little greenery giving a unique and beautiful effect.

It is a near relative of the wild carrot or "Queen Anne's Lace," which has been in old-fashioned gardens for many years, and a near relative also of the garden carrot, the caraway and other plants of the family characterized by producing their flowers in umbrella-shaped clusters.

U. OF W. WINS RELAY CARNIVAL

SEATTLE, Apr. 25.—The University of Washington with a total of 22 points won the annual Washington relay carnival here Saturday. Oregon Agricultural college was second with 12 points; and the University of Southern California was third with 10 points. The University of Oregon was fourth

with seven points. The pentathlon, the feature event of the meet, was won by Tuck of the University of Oregon with a total of 3,111.261 points. DeWitt of Whitman college was second with 2,744.922 points and Perrine of the University of Idaho was third with 2,515.524 points.

In the team events the University of Oregon scored seven points, the University of Idaho four points, Whitman college three and Washington one. The University of Montana failed to place.

The 100 yard dash was won by Hurley of the University of Washington, with Anderson of Washington State college second and Stening of Montana third. The time was 10.25 seconds.

The University of Southern California team set a new record of the carnival for the mile relay, the time being 3 minutes 30.44 seconds. The time made last year was 32.1.2 seconds.
