North Powder, April 27th.**COYOTES KILL MORE DEER
THAN HUNTERS**Editor Observer: Coyotes slaugh-
ter more deer than all of the hunters
combined. Our game commission is
fighting to protect the game. Would
it not be better to fight the coyotes
that kill more game than all the hun-
ters combined?This is the conclusion I have arriv-
ed at, as I have taken the opportunity
to study wild animal life the past few
years, during the time of my work as
federal patrolman, while trapping coy-
otes and wildcats during the winter.Most hunters are aware that the
deer have increased wonderfully dur-
ing the past few years. This is due
to several causes: First, hydrophobia
thinned out the coyotes a few years
ago; second, deer increase very fast.Up the Grande River, where the
snow gets very deep in the moun-
tains, the deer are forced to findwinter feeding ground near the river.
In the winter, follow the game. In the
spring, the birds and rabbits
are getting scarce, and the coy-
otes and cats are depending on the
game for food. Two or three
coyotes can kill any deer. One will
hunting it, while the other will get
it by the throat. They usually start
praying on the deer in November or
December during February and March
a deer is quite heavy, and it is pitiful
the way the coyotes single out the
deer during this season, as they are
easier on their feet and easily
caught. It is pitiful to see the poor
things making for water, their ton-
gues out. If they succeed in getting
to open water, they can fight the coy-
otes off. The latter will gather on
the bank, and when one ventures into
the water, the deer jumps at the coy-
ote with its forefeet. Coyotes also
kill beaver and porcupines. They turn
the latter over on its back in order
to eat it. Last winter, we found
where the coyotes had slain eight
deer within a radius of three-fourths
of a mile from our camp.Coyotes are becoming very hard to
trap. One of the best means to kill
them is to get Russian stag hounds
and employ competent men that can
bring down the coyote on the run.
Two good hunters, who understand
hunting coyotes with hounds, can work
over a large scope of territory. The
dogs, if trained well when pups, will
not chase the deer or other wild life.The government has thinned out
the cougars of our section of the
country. The Ray brothers, who spent
a few days recently at our camp, on
their way from John Day, killed five
cougars in their section of the
country this winter and about 150
coyotes. One of the boys was confined
to his bed for about a month, from
injuries received from a cougar.Why not declare war on the coy-
otes? Why not employ good men to
hunt down the coyotes, and not em-
ploy so many game wardens to see
that some poor fellow is fined for
hunting, or that a fisherman gets too
many trout, when these same fish are
dying by the millions up Five Points
and Dark Canyon, and Spring Creek,
when these streams go dry? A large
number of the violators killing deer
out of season remark that they might
as well have the deer as the coyotes.
And there is not often one of them re-
ported, unless it is through malice.Some time ago, there was a band of
about fifty deer grazing on the young
bunch grass in a pocket around the
bluffs above the sheep bridge. There
were six coyotes feasting on them.
They would capture one whenever
they felt hungry. If such an instance
as this were reported, nothing would
be done, for the game wardens can-
not get a fine out of the coyotes. But
if it were some poor man with a lot
of little hungry mouths to feed, the
game wardens would have given him
a fine.Up-river people will back up my
statement that the coyotes do kill
much game. E. W. Wheeler, Jess
Plunket, stockmen; Fred Hagey, U.
S. mail carrier, all will back up my
statement.So why not get the public to coop-
erate, and have a campaign against
the deer-destroying coyote?
