The dress for a woman who rides in the park is as definitely prescribed as for a man. Her habit is of black, blue, tan or gray oxford, the breeches full but close fitting at the knees, the coat fitting close across her white waistcoat plaited at the waistline, and falling almost to the knees. With it is worn a shirt with a low pointed collar and four-in-hand tie. The hair is arranged low beneath a small derby hat. Puttees or gray gloves dress the hands, and a sporting crop of twisted chongs replaces the whip.

In summer, in the country, if the weather is warm, a straw sailor hat replaces the heavy felt derby, and a light habit of white or tan mohair is substituted for one of tweed. MINISTERS IN FAVOR OF 'Y'

At the meeting of the ministerial association yesterday morning the ministers put their approval on the four-fold development program for boys adopted by the Y. M. C. A. here recently. This program is being adopted in the Sunday schools of the city.

The ministerial association decided to appoint representatives from each church to co-operate with the committee in charge of the work. The purpose of this committee is to further the work for boys and help line up leaders for the boys' clubs.

The Y. M. C. A.'s new idea of service membership was also endorsed by the association. The requirements for service memberships do away entirely with paid memberships for boys and the sole qualification is that the boy will have to line himself up with some club and be chartered for the four fold development program and required to give service through the club. This service is to be given through six different channels, through the church, the school, the home, the community,

to the other fellow and the club itself. All boys desiring the privileges of the Y. M. C. A. may do so through these service agencies.
