MOVEMENT OF WHEAT IS HEAVY

PORTLAND, May 13.—Movement of wheat from the producing regions east of the Cascade mountains to Portland for export is in exceptionally heavy volume. This movement is averaging more than 130 cars daily and is expected to continue for some weeks. Since the first of this year Portland has received from the interior nearly 16,000 cars of wheat, compared with about 8,000 cars received at Seattle and Tacoma combined. For the first four months of 1920 the total grain receipts at Portland was only about half of the volume for the first half of this year.

So large is the export of wheat from this port that last week fifteen vessels loaded with wheat departed from Portland. This week will see fully as large a volume of export grain.

Bulk of Crop Sold.
In the opinion of grain dealers, the unsold wheat from last year's crop in Oregon, Washington and Idaho is now about 20 per cent of the 1920 harvest. In some districts the unsold wheat is more than 20 per cent, but for the entire region this figure is believed to be the average.

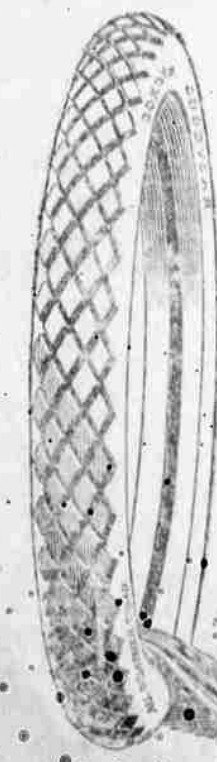
