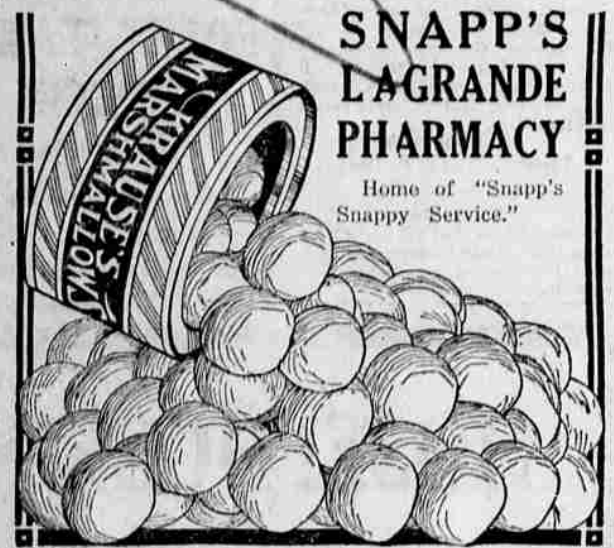

State News Gleaned By Salem News Bureau

(Observer's Salem Bureau)

SALEM, May 19—By an order of the public service commission, the state highway commission is authorized to build two expensive over-grade crossings in Baker Co., at the intersection of the highway with the O.W. R. & N. track. An over-crossing near Unity will cost \$18,000, and another near Hermiston, together with a bridge, will cost \$41,000, while an under-crossing near Durkee will cost \$15,000. Overhead crossing also will be built at the following points in Umatilla and Union counties on the Old Oregon trail: Meacham, Glover, Hilgard, Perry, Hot Lake, Telocaset and North Powder.

The public service commission has authorized the United States Spruce Production corporation to construct several grade crossings over streets and alleys in townsites and subdivisions on railroads Nos. 11 and 12 in Lincoln county.

By July 1 there will be work for everybody in Oregon, in the opinion of C. H. Gram, state labor commissioner in a report to the government. The number of unemployed in the state now is estimated at 7999, of whom 4899 are in Portland. Since April 1 there has been a decrease of 19 per cent in unemployment.

Unless the people of the state of Washington subscribe \$37,500 for 1921 and the same amount for 1922 for the use of the Pacific Northwest Tourist association, the Oregon legislature's appropriation of the same amount will not be available, according to an opinion of Attorney General Van Winkle. The Oregon appropriation was contingent on an equal amount being produced by the state of Washington, either by legislative appropriation or by private subscription. Governor Hart vetoed the Washington appropriation.

The Slide Irrigation district in Malheur county has applied to the state irrigation securities commission for certification of a bond issue of \$100,000 and state guarantee of interest on the bonds. The project embraces 15,000 acres and practically has been completed.

Bids on \$1,000,000 Oregon state highway bonds will be opened by the state highway commission at a meeting in Portland May 27. The bonds will mature October 1, 1926.

The Southern Pacific system has informed Fred A. Williams, chairman of the public service commission, that it will install an automatic block signal system on its west side line between Reedport and Portland. This is known as the Bertha line.

The Iowa association of Oregon, which has as a nucleus of its membership former Iowa residents now living in the Central Willamette valley, gave its annual picnic at the state fair grounds June 17. All Oregon people who formerly lived in Iowa were invited.

The public service commission has issued an order revising the rates of the Grande Ronde Telephone company, which has its offices in Yamhill. Certain improvements in service are made. The change in rates is slight. Herebefore the rate has been \$1 for residence phones and \$2 for business phones. The order makes a rate of \$2 for individual line service and \$1.25 for party lines, not exceeding ten parties.

A. C. Barber, state fire marshal, has issued a statement showing that the April fire loss in Oregon outside of Portland totaled \$123,245. The largest loss was at Eugene, where a garage and contents burned, with a loss of \$50,000.

The state emergency board this middle of the week created deficiencies aggregating \$84,806.50 and made provision for the funds to cover the amount. The money was made necessary by errors in enrolled bills of the last legislature which, because of mistakes in dates, did not make the money available. A sum of \$67,295.50 was allowed for the state's half of coyote bounty funds and \$15,000 for the eradication of predatory animals. The sum of \$2500 was allowed for the

traveling expenses of circuit judges whose districts embraced more than one county. Needs of the state labor department, due to a similar error in the enrolling of a bill, were deferred. For the reason that no petition for the proposed recall of Fred A. Williams, public service commissioner was yet been filed, the board made no provision for funds covering a recall election.

The state board of control has approved tentative plans for the girls' dormitory at the state industrial school for girls, for which an appropriation was made by the last legislature. The estimated cost is \$43,000.

In a general way, the state desert land board has approved of a proposal of the Jordan Valley Land & Water company by which the company hopes to procure \$100,000 in cash to proceed with development of its project in Malheur county. A condition is that the state enter into a contract with the company and reduce its bond from \$100,000 to \$25,000. The district is a Carey act project embracing 25,000 acres.

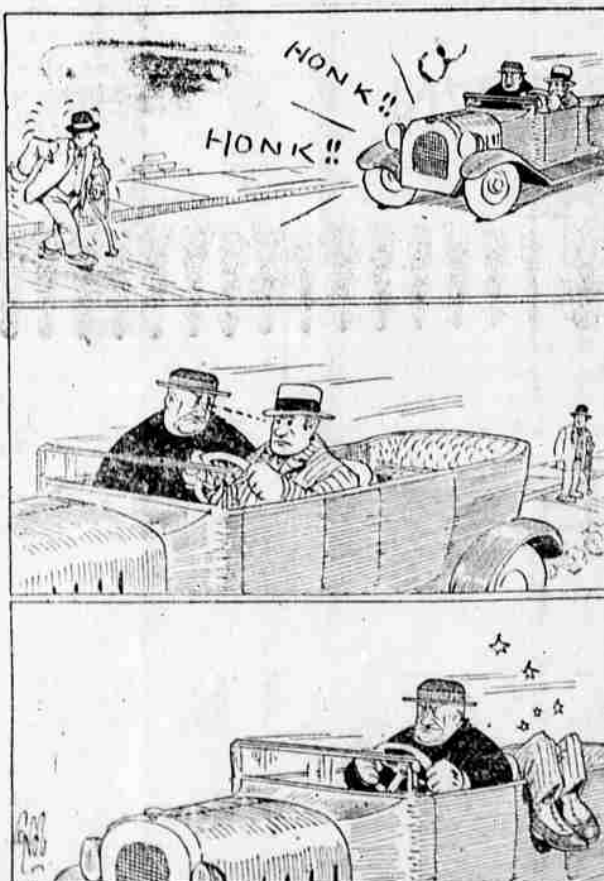

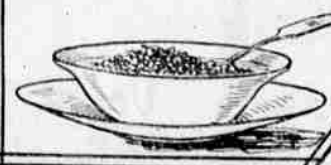
