WHEREAS, The trout and other game fish inhabiting and frequenting the waters of Black Lake and the tributaries thereof, Crawfish Lake and the tributaries thereof, Anthony Lake and the tributaries thereof, Grande Ronde Lake and the tributaries thereof, Mud Lake and the tributaries thereof, and Van Patten Lake and the tributaries thereof, situated within the Counties of Baker and Union, State of Oregon, are threatened with extinction from excessive angling, and from other causes; and

WHEREAS, The Oregon State Game Commission is desirous of protecting the trout and other game fish inhabiting and frequenting the waters of Black Lake and the tributaries thereof, Crawfish Lake and the tributaries thereof, Anthony Lake and the tributaries thereof, Grande Ronde Lake and the tributaries thereof, Mud Lake and the tributaries thereof, and Van Patten Lake and the tributaries thereof, situated within the Counties of Baker and Union, State of Oregon;

NOW, THEREFORE, Notice is hereby given by said Oregon State Game Commission, that Black Lake and the tributaries thereof, Crawfish Lake and the tributaries thereof, Anthony Lake and the tributaries thereof, Grande Ronde Lake and the tributaries thereof, Mud Lake and the tributaries thereof, and Van Patten Lake and the tributaries thereof, situated within the Counties of Baker and Union, State of Oregon, are hereby closed to angling for trout and other game fish, in any manner from December 1st to June 15th of each year.

And it shall be unlawful for any person to take or fish for trout and other game fish, by any means whatsoever, in the waters of Black Lake and the tributaries thereof, Crawfish Lake and the tributaries thereof, Anthony Lake and the tributaries thereof, Grande Ronde Lake and the tributaries thereof, Mud Lake and the tributaries thereof, and Van Patten Lake and the tributaries thereof, from December 1st to June 15th of each year.

Any and all persons whomsoever so angling in violation of this order will be prosecuted as by statute provided.
