NEW SWIMMING TANK STARTED

A CONCRETE TANK WOULD FREEZE AND BURST

Tank Will Have Sloping Sides Making It Easier to Get Out and Will be of Wood

Members of the country club are much pleased at the progress that is being made on their new swimming tank. To a great number the tank is one of the most attractive features of the club. A short time ago a contract for the excavating was let to E. E. Carpenter and his part of the work is now completed. The tank is 50x100 in dimensions and slightly over eight feet deep in the deepest part. The upper end slopes gradually from a depth of one foot. A feature of the tank is that the sides will be sloping, which allows a swimmer to get out of the tank much easier than when the sides are straight.

The original idea was to build the tank of concrete but after considerable investigation it is thought that a wood tank will be better, suited on account of the danger of freezing and bursting a concrete tank. The construction of the tank itself will be started in the next three or four days. The committee also have plans for heating the water in the tank and if this is done the season will be started up as soon as the weather warms up and it will not be necessary to wait for the water in the river to warm. Each week sees an increasing number of golfers out on the links and it is noticeable that once a member turns out to try this game it can be depended on that he is back at the very next opportunity. Owing to the wet weather the greens committee are having difficulty in keeping the grass down but in spite of this handicap each evening sees a number going around the links while Sundays a constant stream of cars are coming and going all day long.

Country club dinners are one feature of the club which are very much appreciated by members and their families. The dining room service is growing in popularity. Each Sunday an average of about fifty has been served and in addition many are served during the evenings of the week. Dinner parties are also becoming very popular with the members.

FORD PRODUCING 1,000 CARS DAILY

Ford is building cars at full speed. And, according to an official statement from the factory at Detroit, the demand for Ford cars and trucks still exceeds the output, despite the fact that a new high level of production has been reached.

By the first of May the figures representing daily production were in the neighborhood of 4,000 a day, so the May schedule was set at 101,125 cars and trucks, not including the output of the Ford Canadian plant or any of the foreign assembling plants. The output mounted daily; May 12th brought forth 4097, the greatest number that have been produced in one day so far this year. Since the month has 25 working days, present indications point to a new high record.

A comparison of Ford production figures for 1920 and 1921 discloses the fact that for April, 1921, the output was greater by 2,514 than for the corresponding month of a year ago. The output for May 1921, will probably overshoot May, 1920, by between 4,000 and twenty thousand cars and trucks.
