## BULLET HITS KAMELA BOY

KAMELA, May 27.—(Special)—What might have proved a very serious accident occurred Wednesday, when Murrel Fugget, aged 13, son of Mr. and Mrs. Cap Fugget, was shot in the left upper leg, the bullet passing in a downward course through the left leg and through the lower right leg. Murrel was on the Burnett farm at the time of the accident, in company with John and Dan Curran, boys about the same age as Murrel. The boys had borrowed a pistol of the Stephens type .22 calibre and were sitting on a log in a line when the pistol was accidentally discharged, the bullet hitting Fugget.

The accident occurred late in the afternoon, and the boys walked home, arriving at 6:55. When the fugget boy arrived home he did not mention the accident to his parents, and it was not until the Curran boys had spread the news that his mother learned of the accident, when Murrel told his mother that one of the boys accidentally shot him.

Mr. Fugget brought his son to La Grande on the evening train, where it was dressed by the doctor, who reports that the case will not be serious, unless complications set in.

The gun was in bad order, failing to discharge the cartridge until snapped a good many times. All of the boys are familiar with fire arms, and were not expecting the gun to be discharged when the accident happened.
