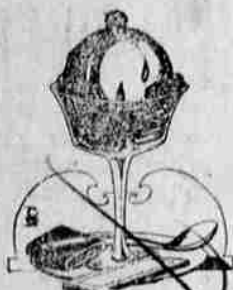

BELIEVES IN BONUS BILL

La Grande, Ore., May 31st, 1921.
The La Grande Observer: Information has come to me that some person or persons are circulating mis-information in La Grande and vicinity about the Canadian Government War Bonus Bill for the benefit of Canadian World War Veterans, the object of such mis-information being the defeat of the Oregon bonus legislation.

Having been a Canadian soldier and also having received said bonus, I will quote from the Canadian Bonus Bill. Anyone wishing further information may get same by addressing the writer.

"Married men with dependents, who are in receipt of separation allowance, \$100 per month; all other, \$70 per month. In both cases this is to be paid in lieu of said pay and allowance. The first payment will be made at the date of discharge, the balance in monthly payments."

(a) In the Canadian Expeditionary Force for three years, any part of which was overseas six months. (b) In the Canadian Expeditionary Force for two years and under three years, any part of which was overseas five months; (c) for one year and under two years, any part of which service was overseas four months; (d) for less than one year, any part of which

was overseas three months. Not being eligible for bonus in this state, I am writing this in the interests of justice and fair play.

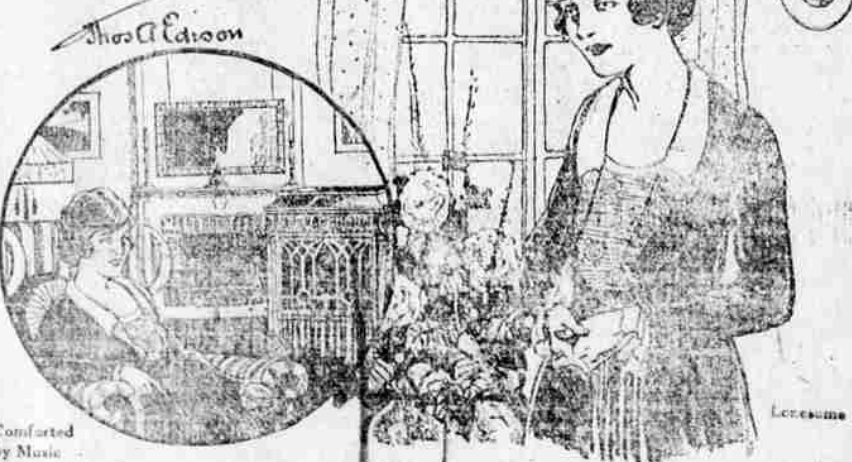
