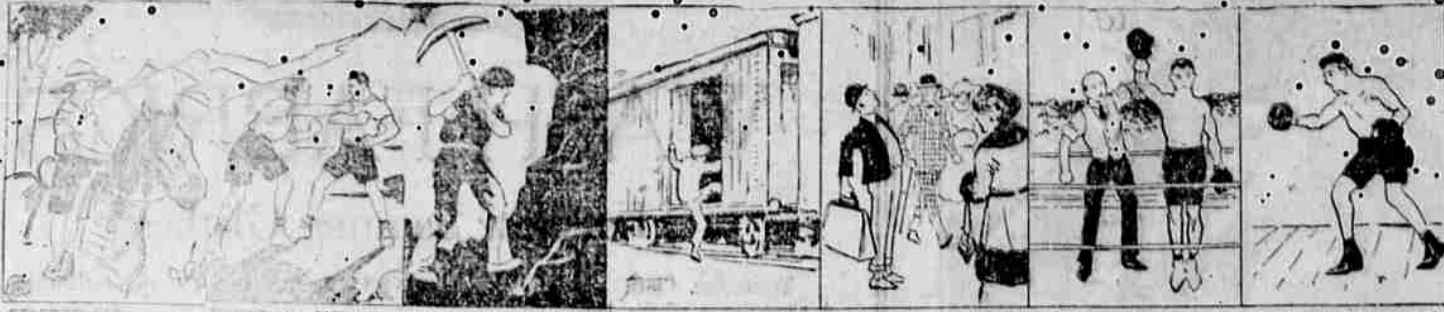


HIGH SPOTS IN LIFE OF CHAMPION JACK DEMPSEY TOLD IN PICTURES.

Weekly News Letter From State Capital

Observer Salem Bureau. SALEM, Ore., June 9.—(Special)—Representatives of the public service commissions of Oregon, Washington and Idaho will meet in Portland, June 13 and 14, to consider a proposal relative to a joint, equalized schedule of rates and accounting for public utilities operating in the three states. A preliminary conference was held in Olympia last week.

Whether the Orchard Water company, successor to the Willow River Land & Irrigation company, has completed its water rights on Willow creek in Malheur county in compliance with an original agreement with the state is a question that has been submitted to the state water board, and which the board has taken under advisement.

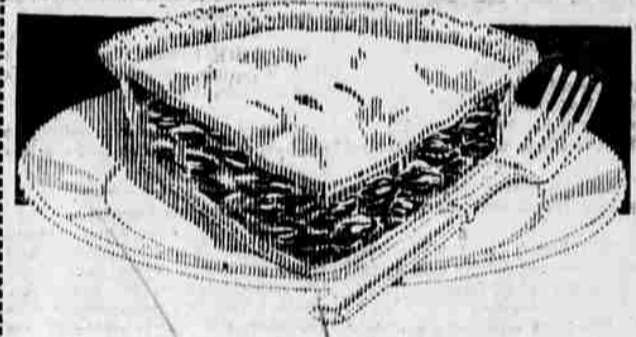
The state board of engineering examiners will conduct an examination at 620 Corbett building, Portland, Friday, July 8, for registration of professional engineers.

Laws enacted by the 1921 session of the Oregon legislature, and which were not effective as soon as signed by the governor through having the emergency clause attached, became effective May 25, the expiration of the ninety-day period following the closing of the session. A total of 354 laws became effective on that date, none having been held up by the referendum. Fifty-eight acts carried the emergency clause.

Money of the state irreducible school fund cannot legally be loaned on land in irrigation districts that has been bonded, or that has incurred other extensive liabilities, according to an opinion of Attorney General Van Winkle, written in reply to an inquiry by G. G. Brown, clerk of the state land board. Money already so loaned will not be withdrawn, but the loans will not be renewed.

The state board of control has awarded to the firm of Graham & Atkin a contract to construct an industrial building at Oregon School for the deaf and to McPherson & Urban a contract to install the heating system. The bids were \$12,853 and \$114,192, respectively.

letter to the operators the commission points out that amendment to the law, effective July 1, will automatically adjust the same, affording a reduction of from 10 to 30 per cent to 75 per cent of the Eastern Oregon operators who are now under the net. This may prevent some of the proposed withdrawals.

The Southern Pacific Railroad company violated the law when it transported from Coos Bay to Portland a man afflicted with leprosy. According to Attorney General Van Winkle, for the reason that the conductor was informed the man had leprosy, as was also the agent at Eugene who sold him a ticket.

Fred W. Mulkey, Louis J. Goldsmith and S. L. Sabin of Portland have been appointed by Governor Olcott as members of the tax supervising and conservation commission for Multnomah county, provided by the last legislature.

Governor Olcott has appointed E. B. Hughes of Astoria as a member of the state embalmers' examining board, created by the last legislature. The law provides that the other members shall be the secretary of the state board of health and the secretary of the Oregon Funeral Directors' association. These are respectively Dr. F. D. Stricker and A. D. Kenworthy, both of Portland.

The state desert land board has under advisement an application of the Summer lake and the Silver lake irrigation districts to sell securities aggregating \$535,000 at 80 cents on the dollar.
