

WILL AID IN GETTING BONUS

Former service men who are entitled to a bonus under the Washington state bonus law do not have to go to Olympia to collect their bonus, according to announcement made by Mrs. Fay T. Catlin, secretary of the local Red Cross today. Mrs. Catlin stated that she had all of the blanks necessary in her office.

Several former men who are entitled to bonus from the state of Washington have been under the impression that it is necessary to go to Olympia to secure the bonus and one recently made a trip there for that purpose, spending all he got for traveling expenses.

Two witnesses must swear to the fact that the men were bona fide residents of Washington at the time of their enlistment and the original discharge certificate for a duplicate if the original has been lost must be in the possession of the applicant when filling out his application which can be secured from Mrs. Catlin.

Mrs. Catlin also stated that as soon as the blanks for the bonus under the Oregon laws are available she will have some of those on hand and will be glad to give her assistance in filling them out.

LICENSE LAW TO BE AMENDED

A petition, with forty-seven signatures, was presented to the city commission Wednesday evening asking that the peddlers' license ordinance be so amended that the tax on ice cream peddlers be either repealed or materially reduced.

The city commissioners were united in the belief that the present license rate is prohibitive and that ice cream peddlers and others who do not come under the same classification with itinerant peddlers should not pay as high a license.

After a thorough discussion in which all commissioners repeatedly voiced the opinion that a more just license should be established, the city attorney, James D. Slater, was instructed to draw up an amendment to the license law reducing the license of ice cream vendors to \$10 a month or \$25 a quarter. At present the license is \$6 a week, \$18 a month and \$30 a quarter when a vehicle is used by the vendor, and \$5 a week, \$15 a month and \$20 a quarter when the vendor travels on foot.

HOME FROM AUTO CALIFORNIA TRIP

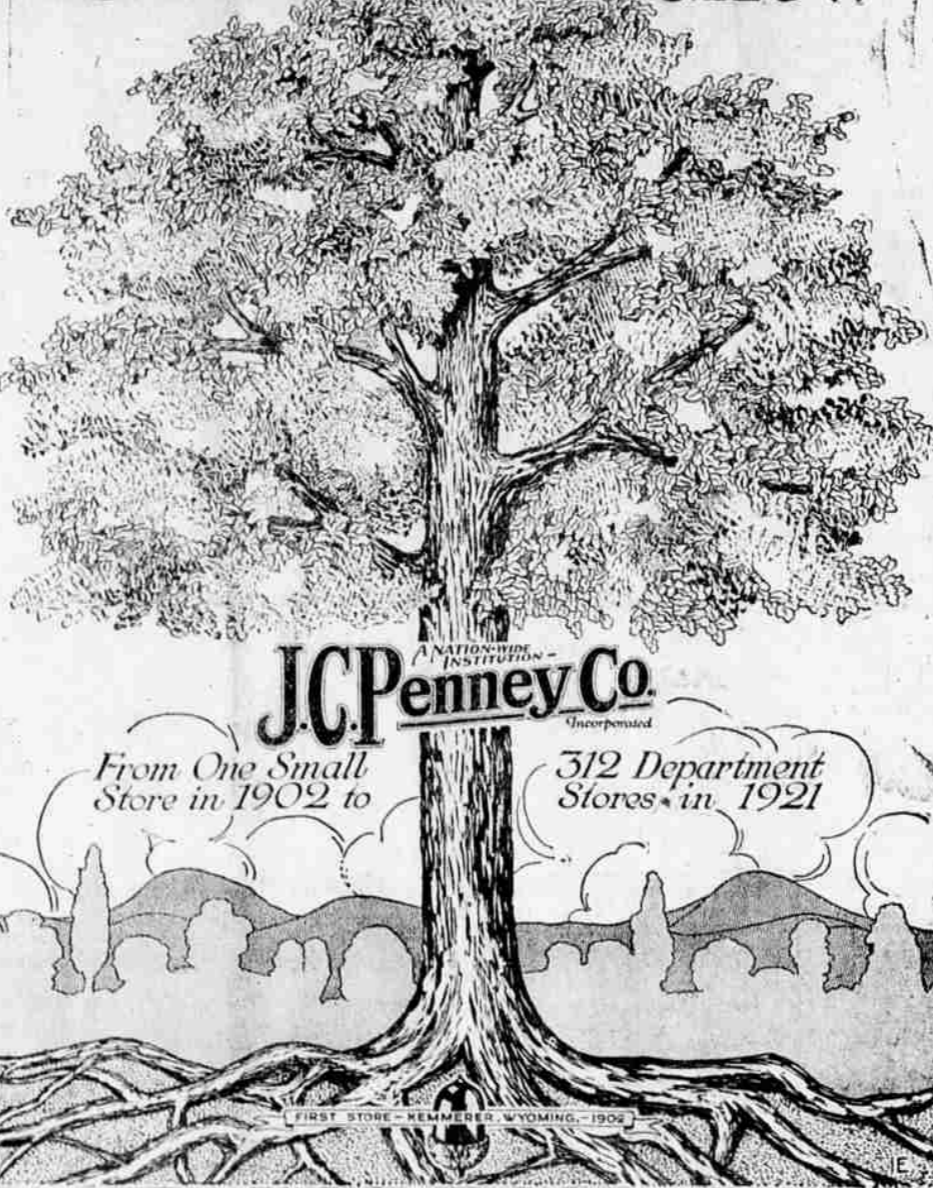
