LARGE DEPOSITS ARE AGGREGATED

PORTLAND BANKS LEAD STATE SALEM COMES SECOND.

State Bank Report Just Issued. La Grande Stands Fifteenth With \$2,286,283.41.

SALEM, June 11.—There are 59 towns and cities in Oregon that have bank deposits aggregating more than \$500,000 and in which total deposits amount to \$218,894,794.91, according to a report prepared here by Frank C. Bramwell, state superintendent of banks. The report was based on statements received from the various banking institutions in Oregon at the close of business April 28.

Portland banks with aggregate deposits of \$128,939,859.12, lead the entire state, with Salem in second place with deposits amounting to \$8,119,418.19. Astoria, with deposits aggregating \$6,674,104.19 ranks third, while Eugene is fourth on the list with \$5,679,167.12. Pendleton is a close fifth, with deposits totalling \$5,946,344.48. La Grande stands fifteenth with \$2,286,283.41. The total deposits of the 136 other towns in Oregon, which fell below the \$500,000 mark, is \$22,952,199.49, increasing the deposits of all depositories in Oregon under supervision of the state banking department to \$240,856,813.41.

WILL MOVE WHOLE TOWN OF AMERICAN FALLS, IN IDAHO

POCATELLO, Idaho, June 11.—Removal of the entire town of American Falls, Idaho, with its population of 2000, two or three miles to a new site higher than its present location, is to be attempted within a few months by engineers working on a huge irrigation project.

Waters of the Snake river, on which American Falls is located, are to be dammed, according to present plans, and will be used to reclaim some 300,000 or more acres of arid land now given over to the sage brush. Engineers say the project is one

of the largest ever attempted. The big dam itself will have an abutment of one mile in length, will be sixty feet high and will have a base sufficiently strong to stand an additional thirty feet should it ever be deemed necessary to add to its height.

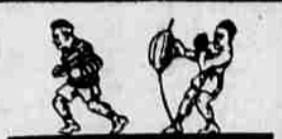

WALTER A. COOPER HAS LONG CRUISE ON PACIFIC. U. S. Marines Stationed at Cavite. Find Many Affairs of Interest at Nearby Points.

After a long cruise across the Pacific, Walter A. Cooper of La Grande, a son of Mrs. Jennie Cooper, 1422 Monroe street, is now stationed with the U. S. marines at Cavite in the Philippine Islands. He arrived there recently with a detachment of marines who are to have a tour of foreign duty. Young Cooper joined the marines in Portland last October. He was transferred to Mare Island, Cal., where he received his preliminary military training and from where he sailed a short time ago. He paid visits to Guam and the Hawaiian Islands en route. Cavite is situated on Manila bay, where Admiral Dewey destroyed the Spanish fleet in 1898. A garrison of marines has been maintained there ever since Spanish-American war days. There are many points of interest in and about Cavite, and the marines pay frequent visits to Manila, which lies directly across the bay and can be reached by either steamer or rail.

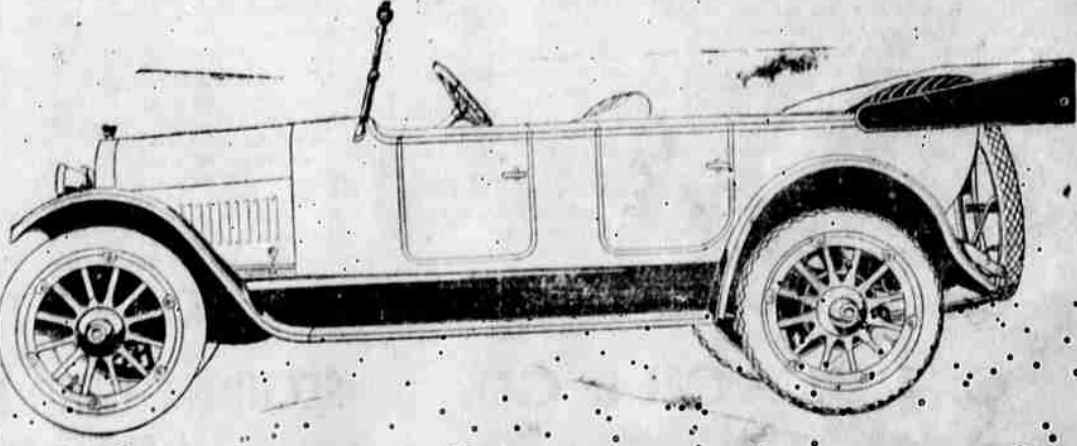
