FREE LECTURE IS TONIGHT

CHRISTIAN SCIENCE IS TOPIC
OF LECTURE THIS EVENING

Speaker Points to Great Growth of
Teachings—Now Predominant
Religion in Far North.

Christian Science is the main religious activity in both the Yukon territory and Alaska now, according to William Porter, C. S. B., of New York City, member of the board of Lectureship of The Mother Church, The Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, Massachusetts, who arrived here this morning to give a free lecture on Christian Science at the Star Theatre this evening.

Mr. Porter pointed to the growth of Christian Science in the Far North as an example of widespread growth of his church throughout the civilized world.

"It was my privilege and pleasure last year to lecture in Alaska and the Yukon," Mr. Porter declared. "Six years ago we started our lecture work in the Yukon. We gave one lecture that year. The work was continued each year and last year eleven lectures were given in the Yukon. One-third of the white population attended these lectures. Christian Science is the main religious activity in both the Yukon and Alaska today. Even the Indians are calling for practitioners."

This evening Mr. Porter will talk on "Christian Science, the Restorer." In discussing his lecture he said: "Christian Science restores the teachings of Christ in their completeness. It deals with not only the preachings of the gospel but also with healing by the gospel."

"Many people think Christian Science a new thing. But Mrs. Eddy herself says that it is as old as God, so it is a restoration of a religion that which has heretofore been, that which Jesus Christ taught."

REBUILDING IS NEARLY DONE

The rebuilding of the front of that part of the La Grande National Bank building, the lower floor of which is not used by the bank is rapidly nearing completion. The front of the lower floor conforms to the general architectural scheme of the bank, but more window space is provided than in that part of the bank building used for banking purposes, better serving the purpose of store rooms. Saturday night the old stairway was cut down and a landing put about halfway up. The finishing touches are being put on this week by the contractors and before the end of next week it is expected that the entire front will be finished. According to the building permit issued for the work, the estimated cost was \$4,000.
