Tom Skeyhill, Australian Soldier-Poet, Tells Thrilling Story of Recent Russian Experiences

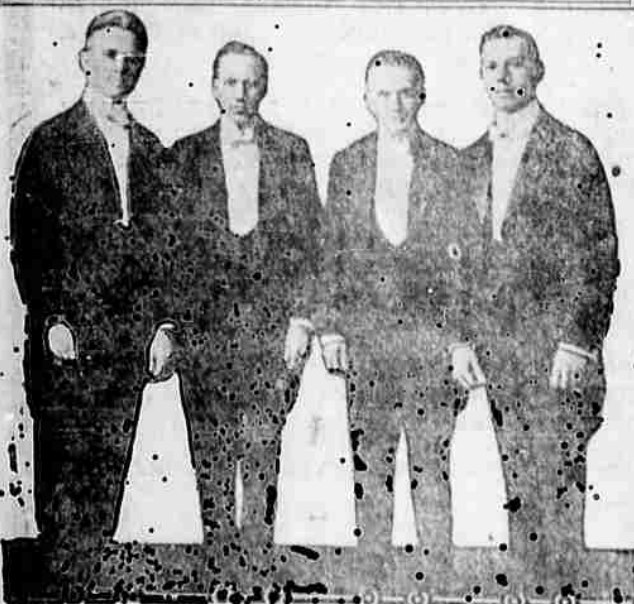
