State News

Col. James A. Panting of Baker, chairman of the Near East Relief in Baker county, has received an invitation to be a member of the party visiting Armenia during the coming summer. The purpose of the proposed trip is to gain first hand information of the needs of the people and to attend meetings in Constantinople and Paris, of the American committee on Armenian relief. All expenses are paid.

"Let 'er Buck," Colonel Charles Wellington Furlong's book of the Pendleton round-up, will be off the press before the end of July, according to word received by the author from Putnam & Sons, publishers.

Charles H. Dodd, for half a century one of Portland's prominent business men and citizens, died recently at the age of 83 years.

Heading of winter rye has started in Pleasant Valley, on the dry farms. It is estimated the fields will run from 15 to 20 bushels per acre.

From 15 to 25 per cent of the 1920 wheat crop in Wasco county remains unsold on the eve of the 1921 harvest.

Out of 1700 head of cattle in Deschutes county subjected to the tuberculin test since April 4, only 10 have reacted, according to G. W. Trubey, veterinary inspector for the bureau of animal industry, who is conducting the work. The 10 tubercular cattle have been properly disposed of, the owners receiving indemnity as provided by law.

Mrs. Archie McCrae of Thomas, Ore., was killed and her husband seriously injured Wednesday morning when their car was hit by the Roseburg Southern Pacific passenger train, at the crossing near Albany.

"Eat more cheese" is to be the official motto of the state of Oregon for one week beginning June 20 during a state wide campaign to be conducted under the direction of the Oregon Dairy Council, the aim of which is to encourage the use of cheese of every description.

Forty carloads of cherries will probably be shipped from The Dalles in the next three or four weeks, constituting the greatest movement of small fruits from that vicinity ever recorded here.

Seventy thousand gray digger squirrels were killed in Lane county during a recent campaign.

Application for a charter for the proposed Columbia Commercial bank of Portland, has been rejected by Frank C. Bramwell, state bank superintendent.

Unless the rain damage is excessive this year, there will be near 3,000,000 pounds of cherries within hauling distance of Salem this year.

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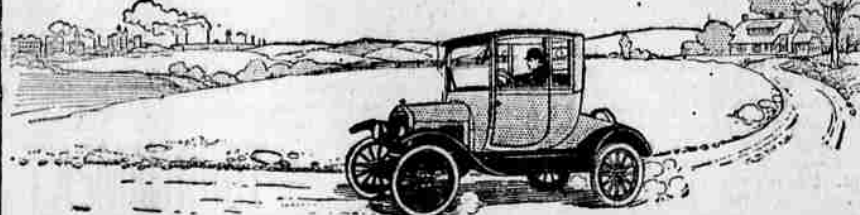
