WILL APPOINT NUMBER TO SERVE ON STAFF WITHOUT ANY PAY

WASHINGTON, June 23.—Chas. G. Howe, appointed head of the new government budget system, announced after a conference with President Harding today, that he will appoint a number of experienced business men to serve the budget bureau without pay, as he considered the staff provided by Congress inadequate.

CONTROL OF MEAT PACKING INDUSTRY FAVORED BY LABOR

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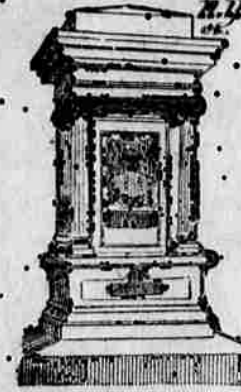

The Moslems' Sacred Black Stone. The Kaaba, or Kaaba, the most sacred shrine of Mohammedanism, is a black cube-shaped stone, the roofed building in the center of the Great Mosque of Mecca. In the northeast corner is the famous "black stone." This stone is of irregular shape, about seven inches in diameter and possibly of meteoric origin. When Mohammed returned triumphantly to Mecca, he destroyed all the idols except the Kaaba, which had fallen into pagan use, but spared the "black stone," which all Moslems venerate.
