

ROAD CONDITIONS IN EASTERN OREGON

From the Morrow-Gilliam county line to 15 miles east of Pendleton, excellent gravelled roads; the county bridge over the Umatilla river is still closed on account of high water; necessary to take ferry at this point.

From end of gravelled road to Lillard, mountain road; very rough, but passable.

From Lillard to La Grande, road under construction; requires very careful driving; this road between Perry and La Grande will be closed to traffic on June 28 from 7 a. m. until June 29, 7 a. m. (This date subject to change. Will give due notice.)

La Grande to Hot Lake, pavement and macadam.

Hot Lake to Union, foothill detour road in fair condition; water receding in valley road; bad mud holes; road rough and soft; grading construction in progress.

Union to Haines, good going. Haines to Baker, excellent macadam.

Baker to Nelson, fair county road. Nelson to Huntington, road under construction; detour road from Nelson school house to Weatherby in good shape; two steep hills.

Huntington to Ontario, take ferry at Olds (no night service on account of high water) via Weiser and Payette; condition of road fair; from Weiser to Ontario, under construction.

Ontario south to Nyssa, good. Ontario to Vale, quite rough.

Vale to Ironside, reported good. Vale to Burns; tourists report this road very bad.

From Vale to Unity, Unity to Baker, Baker to Prairie City, no report this week.

Baker to Halfway, first 10 miles macadamized; balance of way fair.

La Grande to Island City, paved.

Island City to Wallowa Hill, fair; rough in spots.

Wallowa Hill through Wallowa Canyon to Rock Creek, very rough; detour to Smith Hill switchback well marked; canyon will be open about July 1.

End of Wallowa Canyon to Wallowa, dry and fairly smooth; route detours; take road to left at head of canyon (hillside road); other roads are open at this date, but river rising and there is danger of temporary bridges going out; drive carefully between Wallowa river and Bear creek bridge and at all bridges.

Wallowa to Enterprise, road fair; detour by Pace bridge best route to Evans, Lostine and Enterprise; take Wade Gulch and Trout Creek Hill road; road from Wallowa to Lostine via Miles bridge very rough on account of construction; road from Wallowa to Evans and Lostine via Alexander bridge closed, bridge washed out.

Enterprise to Wallowa Lake, somewhat rough at present; detours well marked.

Pendleton to Washington State Line, paved with exception of stretch between Weston and foot of Dry Creek hill; rough detour; this link in the pavement will be open to traffic about July 1.

Pendleton to Pilot Rock, road under construction; rough and dusty; the worst features of this road can be avoided by taking detour along east side of Birch Creek.

Heppner to Umatilla county line, fair, but rough in places; detour over hill from Lone to Lexington coming week; construction in progress.

Heppner to Gilliam county line very rough.

Heppner to Jones Hill, construction in progress; detours will be provided as necessary.

Flooding of the carburetor is caused by several possible troubles. A needle valve may be held open or be leaking. Dirt may have collected on the seat of the valve, preventing its closing, or the following may be the causes: Imperfect or worn needle valve or seat; mechanism stuck; a too heavy or leaking float, which would sink too deep, holding the needle valve open; level too high; loose spray nozzle.

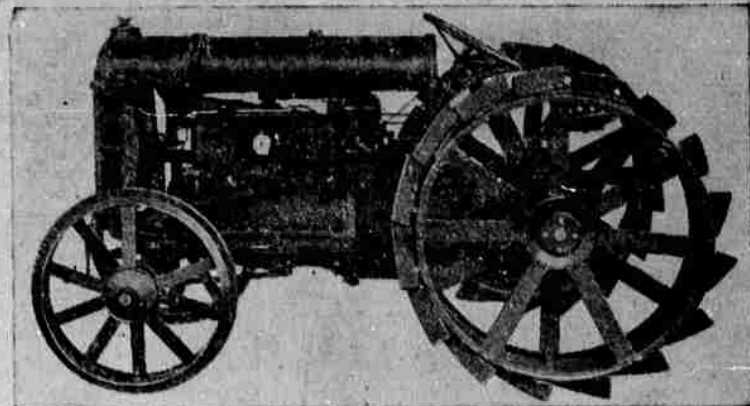

New Shock Absorber Idea.

A new automobile shock absorber utilizes the principle of the resistance of oil against flowing through a
