BAKER, June 25.—It seems that Deputy Sheriff B. M. Patterson and acting Chief of Police Frank Littlefield made an important capture Thursday evening when they arrested H. Paul Hayden and Bessie Hayden. The couple are alleged to be implicated in the stealing of an automobile at Boise and other acts. The arrest was made at the request of the sheriff of Ada county, Idaho.

Andrew Robinson, of the sheriff's office at Boise, arrived in Baker yesterday morning and detained with the prisoners, who waived extradition.

Mr. Robinson stated that "Mr. and Mrs. Hayden and Arthur Kindley, a third member of the trio wanted, who was captured at Weiser, are unique among auto thieves, being what is characterized as 'auto tramps'."

BERGDOLL'S SUBSTITUTE WAS KILLED IN ACTION

PHILADELPHIA, June 25.—The man who took Grover Bergdoll's place when the convicted draft evader failed to answer the call died a hero in the Argonne after being cited for bravery in action. He was R. C. Cross, of this city, a private in Company E, 328th infantry, who was killed by bullets from a machine gun nest which later was captured by Company G of the same infantry. This was revealed by the Overbrook post of the American Legion after an investigation. The post announced it would change its name to that of the fallen hero, "who was forced into service ahead of his turn by Bergdoll."
