Wheat Sells for One Dollar

PENDLETON, June 30.—Seven hundred thousand bushels of new crop wheat, for delivery during July and August, has been contracted for by H. W. Collins, local grain man, at prices which approximate \$1 a bushel. Contracts made by other local grain concerns will bring the total number of bushels of new crop wheat already sold up to the million mark, it is believed.

Wheat contracted for by Collins is all for export and will be moved directly onto cars for shipment when delivered. No wheat has been sold by the Collins company to northwest mills, as few mills are as yet operating. The bulk of the wheat contracted for is from Umatilla county, although some wheat has been purchased from neighboring counties.

The bumper crops of this year surpass those of the last two years when only sixty and eighty per cent yields were realized. The total number of bushels of wheat in the county last year was 5,200,000, and the year before around 4,500,000, with the average yield per acre 23 bushels and 18 respectively.

Fear of depression in the price of wheat has caused many of the growers to contract for all or a large part of their new crop this year, while others have contracted for what they thought they could deliver during the July and August period.

But few contracts have been made in the county by representatives of northwest millers, practically all wheat being for export and already sold by the grain company.
