

# HUG REUNION IS BIG EVENT

Among the many family reunions held in the Grande Ronde valley annually, the Hug club can be said to be one of the most enthusiastic about having crowds out. Speaking of the 1921 reunion held in Elgin a few days ago by the Hug family, the Recorder goes on to say:

A week ago Sunday was an extra fine day for holding the Hug family reunion, and about 120 members of the clan availed themselves of the opportunity and came to enjoy the festivities. Most of them hadn't very far to come, but those who did have a long way to travel were not deterred by that fact, but hopped on the rattler and came anyway.

From St. George, Utah, came Mrs. Juliette Graf, and from the other direction Miss Irah Courtney traveled all the way from Ballston, in Polk county, away down in the midst of the Willamette valley. Miss Courtney is a niece of Mr. and Mrs. John Niederer of La Grande, and a friend and accepted member of the clan of Hug, Mr. and Mrs. George Bade and children came over from Milton, and Mr. and Mrs. Harry Ryan came from Weiser, Idaho, to attend the function. All of these are members in good standing of the Hug clan.

Besides these, there was a "wad" of Hugs coming in from points not so far distant, such as Summerville, La Grande, Imbler and other places. Besides, of course, the bulk of the Hugs who live in and near Elgin.

The program consisted of one of the most dinners anyone could wish to sit before him, followed by literary and musical selections. Bernal Hug gave a history of the family from and before the time the first of the Hugs came to America, which was very interesting. Harry Hug was chairman of the day, and at the close of the meeting was re-elected to that position, together with Miss Lydia M. Hug of La Grande, secretary, and Bernal Hug as historian, to serve for the ensuing year.

Ray Hug gave the invocation. The Niederer brothers rendered a Swiss yodel song, and led an encore song, participated in by about a dozen other musical Hugs. After roll call, "America" was sung by all the Hugs, which was followed by Bernal's history of the Hug family, which incidentally included a considerable part of the history of Switzerland as well. Then there was an instrumental duet by W. F. Hug and Jake Hug, a recitation by Miss Florence Hug, followed by election of officers for the ensuing year.

There were 115 registered on the books of the Hug records, and it is likely that quite a number omitted to put their names down, although requested to do so. Probably 200 persons were in attendance at the picnic. Among those from out of town who attended were:

A number of Hugs in various parts of the country were not notified in time to enable them to attend. August Hug of Los Angeles, Cal., sent a letter expressing regret that he was one of these, and that he was unable to come. One or two other such letters were also read.

The oldest Hug in point of years who attended the reunion was Mrs. Anna Hug of Elgin, who lives here with her son, Eugene F. Hug. Mrs. Hug is about 85 years of age, and it was decided, out of consideration for her age and to honor her, to hold the next reunion of the Hug clan in Elgin on the last Sunday in June, 1922.

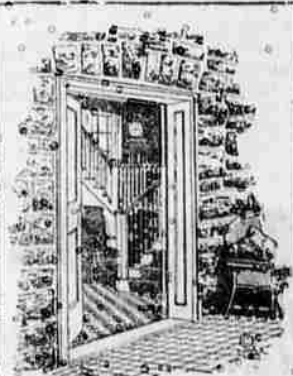
