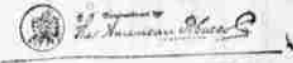

INTEREST IN LIBRARY CONTINUES IN JUNE

Inventory of Library to Be Taken During Summer Months—3,681 Books Loaned in Month.

According to the monthly report of Mary Nichols, librarian, a total of 3,681 books were loaned by the library during June. This is a considerable gain over the same month last year. During the first six months of this year a total of 3,825 more books were loaned by the library than during the same six-month period last year.

Seventy-five new borrowers were added during the month and 77 new books were received during June. The total number of new books placed on the library's shelves since the first of the year is now 500.

An inventory is to be taken in the library this summer. This will be the first time for four years that a complete inventory of the books has been taken.
