### In Defense of Corsets.

Dr. James Cantile, the great surgeon and authority on tropical diseases, is a warm defender of corsets. In his opinion the comparative absence of liver troubles in women is due largely to the equable temperature their bodies obtain through wearing corsets. And more boys than girls die in childhood because the former do not wear corsets. He urges men to wear corsets, a safe and sure protection for men engaged in subduing fires.

### Studying Smoke.

Smoke is perhaps the chief enemy of firefighters. It chokes and may kill. The United States bureau of standards has newly built what it calls a "smoke house," for experiments which are expected to be of practical usefulness to the fire departments of our cities. It will be used to determine exactly what is required to make "smoke masks," a safe and sure protection for men engaged in subduing fires.

Advance to \$8.10 Seen on Few Sacks Shipped in By Express—Carload Expected Soon. Unexpected delays in arrival of a
