FLOUR PRICE DROPS ON COAST

ASTORIA, July 11.—Another slash in the high cost of living was made Saturday when flour took another drop of 50 cents a barrel for baker's flour and 40 cents a barrel for family grade, both in Portland and Astoria. The peak in the price of flour is said to have been reached in May 1920 when the price was \$13.75 a barrel for family grade as compared with \$7.89 the new figure. The new price on bakers flour will be from \$6.75 to \$7.25 a barrel depending on the grade. One local baker said that if flour stays down, bread will undoubtedly come down in price.

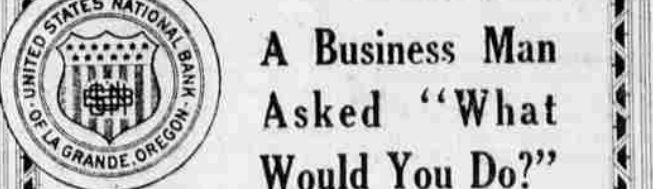
