Market News

Portland markets are, largely, a barometer of local conditions, and the following survey of the Portland situation is of interest in La Grande, in that it reflects general conditions:

Extra fancy eggs are scarce and as a result the market is much firmer. Prices quoted this morning were 2 cents higher than Saturday. The market is well supplied with poor quality eggs, which, of course, did not move rapidly.

Butter market is also firm, especially on high score stock. Offgrade butter is not wanted here, as there is practically no market for it.

The poultry market continues sluggish, with only a limited call. The public is eating fruit, thus making only a limited call for poultry.

Little activity was shown during the day in dressed meats. If a liberal supply had arrived over the week-end the price would have declined.

Good quality cantaloupes were lacking on the street. This was especially true of standards and ponies.

PORTLAND MARKETS. PORTLAND, July 12.—The price of cattle was steady, hogs 60 cents higher, prime light selling for \$11 and \$11.50. Sheep firm, eggs firm and the price of butter steady.
