HUCKLEBERRY CROP DRIES UP

BERRIES HAVE RIPENED PRE-MATURELY AND FALL OFF

Home Grown Cabbage and Spuds Are Especially Fine—Solid Heads of Uniform Size

Even though early indications point to a big crop of huckleberries, it appears that something has occurred to cause premature ripening and withering. The berries dry up and fall off far ahead of their normal time according to reports from those who live in the berry-growing vicinities. Except for this there would have been an immense crop. As it is now the offerings in La Grande are not very heavy and the price is from 60 cents up according to quality.

New Cabbage Excellent

None of the cabbage from famous cabbage sections that have come forward this spring can equal the home grown offerings on the market. The quality is exceptionally good, with solid heads of uniform size.

COOPERATING IN FRUIT CROP

SIX STATES WILL JOIN IN MARKETING SCHEME

Elimination of the Middle Man is to be Attempted in Order to Give Growers Better Price

PORTLAND, July 13—Definite plans have been formulated for the establishment of the central marketing organization for the handling of the fruit crop of the six Pacific coast states represented at the conference here. The appointment of the committee of three members, of each of the marketing organizations in the six states, is provided for in the resolutions adopted. The resolutions declared the object was to eliminate the middleman in order to give the growers the best price and to make the price to the consumers the lowest possible.
