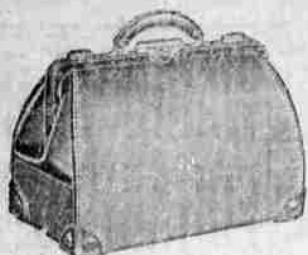

Steel Engraving.

Steel engraving is not named for any individual, but is a process of engraving lines on steel plates, from which plates are tal. Steel plates were first used for engraving about 1820. Between 1830 and 1870 this form of art enjoyed a great vogue. The lines are cut into the steel with a burin or graver, a four-sided piece of steel cut off obliquely at one end, and a sharp point. After the lines are scraped out another tool is used to smooth out and burrish the design.

HANDY GATE FOR DEHORNING

Holder Rigged Up Leaving Sufficient Space for Animal's Head Is Easily Constructed.

A lock gate for catching and holding cows while they are being dehorned and marked, is simple in construction.

First make a gateway in the lot fence, using not less than 4-inch material for the gateposts. Now nail a 6-inch board on each side of these posts, across the gate at the ground, and also two others across at the top of the posts. Close up half of the opening by nailing boards diagonally to the boards at top and bottom of the posts, as illustrated. Get a strong pole, about 4 inches in diameter and 12 feet long. Bore a hole through its large end with a 1-inch auger; also bore through the bottom boards about 8 or 10 inches from the post at the open side of the gate. Let the pole down between the top boards and the bottom ones, and insert a 1-inch nail through the bottom boards and the pole. Then tie a 1-inch rope to the top end of the pole.

When ready to dehorn or mark a large strong animal, drive her toward the gate. Just as she passes her head by the pole, pull it over against her neck, and she is easily held. There

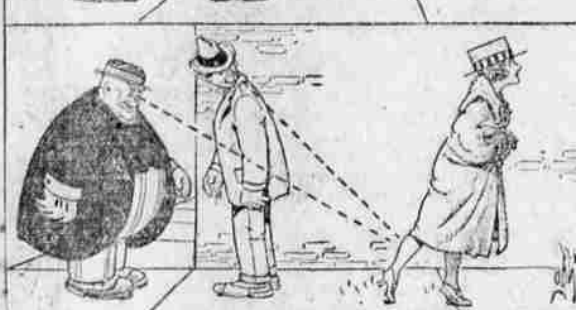
is no danger of her doing damage with her horns, for she cannot move her head. —Popular Mechanics Magazine.
