Other gains in the county will show a great increase in yield. The hay situation, however, is probably the most discouraging to the farmers. With a bumper crop to cut, considerable hay was left over from last year, and no demand in the market the hay raiser has a difficult problem to solve. Everybody seems to have hay to sell and as it usual in such situations there is no one buying.

Following are estimates of yield in each crop:
Wheat, 550,000 bushels.
Oats, 300,000 bushels.
Barley, 200,000 bushels.
Alfalfa 125,000 tons.
Timothy 11,000 tons.

WHEAT FROM GOOSE GROWS

Baker Man Plants Seven Grains Taken From Bird For Seed

BAKER, July 19—Much has been printed and said about wheat that has been found with mummies in the ancient tombs of Egypt, and other grains found in the deserted homes of the cliff dwellers of the Southwest, and of the remarkable growth of the grain when planted after thousands of years. In fact many such stories have surrounded the origin of so-called new varieties of wheat offered for sale as choice seed.

There is, however, no such mystery surrounding some choice seed that Bert Wright, Grose and Second streets, is curing for this season. The original seven grains that have become the special care of Mr. Wright came from the crew of a wild goose, killed last fall, but where said goose got the grain he neglected to divulge before passing to goose heaven.

The seven grains taken from the goose were given to the late Richard Wright, who gave them to Bert Wright and he planted them in his garden. This wheat now stands four and a half feet high and the heads are nine inches long.

Who knows what may result from the experiment of sowing the wheat from these seven grains found in the crew of a wild goose?

BAKER WHEAT CROP BIGGER

Most of Wheat in Baker County is Contracted For by Oregon Co-operative Association

BAKER, July 19—A careful crop survey of Baker county by parties in close touch with the farming dis-

tricts, estimates the 1921 harvest will give a yield of at least ten per cent over the normal for the past five years. This estimate is considered ultra-conservative. On wheat alone one authority makes an estimate of 25 per cent increase. This would mean a yield of 625,000 bushels as compared with 500,000 bushels in previous years.

From 85 to 90 per cent of the wheat grown in the Baker, Halmea and North Powder districts has been contracted for six years under the cooperative marketing plan, and this leaves little of the grain to be con-
