### HOMESEEKERS DATE SET.

19th to September 20 upon request of large numbers of home seekers who are unable to make the trip until after harvest. The Oregon State Chamber of Commerce is making complete preparations for the September trip, according to announcement today. Commercial clubs of the state have been urged to complete the listing of available lands in each community for the information of the settlers, and these listed lands will be placed in the hands of each member of the

party, according to Secretary Quayle. In this way, the homeseeker will know in advance the price and description of actual tracts of land in each district in the state.

George Quayle, general secretary of the State Chamber, left today on a tour of the state for the purpose of securing representatives of various districts who will assist the State Chamber representative in the Middle West in the work of lining up prospective settlers.

A long telegram from Omaha, requesting additional literature on Oregon for distribution among prospective settlers, state that a large number of homeseekers are preparing to come to Oregon in September after harvest is over.



### Lambs Bring Fair Price.

A pleasant bit of news to discouraged sheep men is contained in the announcement from Pendleton that an average price of \$11.25 per hundredweight for 20 carloads of hot house lambs sold on the Chicago market during the past week was secured by Smyth Bros. The announcement goes on to say: "The lambs weighed 82 pounds and the buyers declared them the finest lot of westerners that have been on the market this year. This is the biggest lamb sale for Oregon so far made this season and the price, while not nearly so high as last year, is better than many sheepmen had expected. The lambs were all black face stuff and were the result of cross breeding with Lincoln-Merino ewes and Hampshire rams. They were grown at the big ranch at Arlington and fattened on the Wenaha forest reserve in the vicinity of Gibbon and Black mountain. "On their first shipment of lambs last year Smyth Bros. secured \$46.85
