UNION COUNTY IS IN LEAD

HAS MOST SILOS OF ANY IN EASTERN OREGON.

Wallowa County is Also Building Many Silos—Big Factor in Expense of Fattening Steers.

The use of silage for fattening steers is fast gaining favor in Eastern Oregon as a result of feeding tests at the Union branch experiment station.

Union county leads the district with 160 silos built since 1914, while Wallowa has 70, of which 67 have been constructed since 1917. Lake county has nine, and Klamath, whose silos were a minor quantity in 1919, has nine also. Increase is said to be largely due to the work of the agricultural college extension service through the county agents.

"Silos-owning stockmen can fatten steers at approximately half what it costs the stock raiser who feeds only hay," asserted P. La Ballard, assistant county agent leader, in charge of county agent work in Eastern Oregon, in an interview to the Portland Oregonian.

"With choice steers selling at \$5.50 to \$7 on the Portland market, introduction of cheaper beef production methods in Eastern Oregon is of fundamental importance."

Other projects being worked out by county agents in this district include pest control, carried on in co-operation with farmers and the United States biological survey, for control of rabbits and ground squirrels; pure seed project including field certification of seed crops by a seed specialist; from Oregon Agricultural college; sulphur on alfalfa and Grimm alfalfa seed.

Based on experiments and field results in several counties, one application of 80 to 100 pounds of sulphur to the acre will increase the yield a 40% per acre. Eastern Oregon has more than 100,000 acres that can be benefited. Nearly an equal gain can be had on a somewhat smaller area by use of Grimm alfalfa—hardier type than is commonly planted.
