Breeding Foxes in Captivity.
Approximately 4,500 silver-black foxes are being bred in captivity in the United States, according to reports to the bureau of biological survey, United States Department of Agriculture, from 215 fox ranches, representing a value in animals and equipment estimated at \$4,270,820. All reports have not yet been received, and conservative estimates place the number of silver-black fox in this country at from 5,000 to 6,000.
