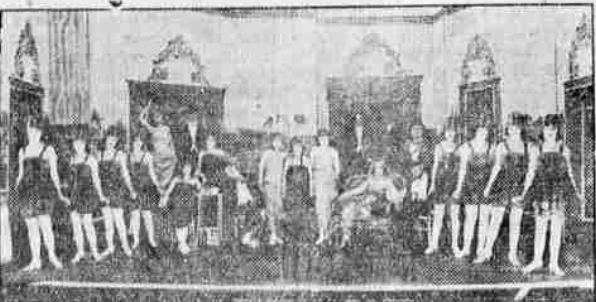

Some Antagonism. It was at first planned to have the road come in above the hospital but the antagonistic attitude of several property owners in regard to giving right of way resulted in the change. Right of way in the city limits has not all been secured. The estimated cost of the grade within the city limits is about \$2100 and outside of the city limits around \$9000. The estimated cost of the overhead crossing is about \$55,000. The county court pointed out that the city would be put to an expense of about \$75,000 if the state highway requirements along the present route were to be met. The expenditure of this sum being necessitated by a viaduct at Second street, meeting the requirements of the state as a grade and structural details and paving the entrance into the city. The entire county court, consisting of County Judge U. G. Couch and Commissioners J. F. Hutchinson and Cecil Galloway, attended the commission meeting. George H. Currey, chairman of a committee from the Ad Club that has been working in behalf of the change in route, also attended the meeting and made some remarks.

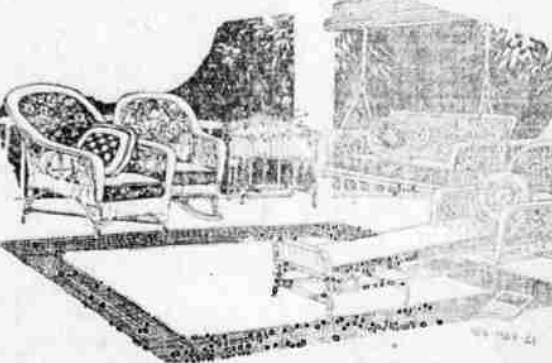
