### CHERRIES ARE ALSO WELL ALONG IN SEASON.

Sharp trading in berries is the rule locally, and in several types of berries are fast slipping off the sales tables, it behooves carriers to be-strict themselves. The red raspberry season is nearing an end and the same is true of black caps. Blackberries on the other hand are just coming forward from home berry patches. The price on raspberries and black caps is strong and growing stronger. Cherries are so well along in their season that canners must act quickly if they get good varieties.

Local dealers are offering peaches but they are not of the choice kind, to date, and probably will not be for several days.

People who bought up their canning sugar a week or two ago showed good business judgment, for the price is steadily increasing. Local merchants have a variety of prices as each appears to be selling as he happened to buy, those who are replenishing their supplies within the last day or two being called on to retail at the new price, while some grocers have big supplies from the bottom quotations.

#### Pendleton I. O. O. F. May Build

Odd Fellows of this vicinity will be interested in knowing that if the Pendleton lodge of I. O. O. F. can sell its building on the corner of Main and Alta streets, plans for the immediate construction of a three or possibly four story building on the lodge's property at the corner of Alta and Garden streets will be made. This decision was reached at a meeting Tuesday night, and the trustees, David H. Nelson, R. F. Kirkpatrick and H. C. Craig, were instructed to make negotiations for the sale of the building. The lodge rejected an offer of \$10,000 from Bentley & Hedges and from E. A. Schiffer for the lot on Alta and Garden streets. The members of the lodge believe that about \$75,000 could be realized from the sale of the Main and Alta street property, basing the estimate on the fact that a standing offer of \$35,000 has been made for the 25 foot lot where the Office Lunch stands.

The new building would cost \$150,000 if plans considered a year ago were carried out, yet lodge members believe this cost would be considerably lower since the decrease in the price of building materials.
