Market News

PORTLAND, July 22 (Special)—The market situation in Portland at the close of business last evening shows the following review:

Trade in the egg market is showing a good tone locally and prices in general are firmly held. No change in the buying price was generally announced for the day, although more were paying 29c for current receipts.

Poultry market continues to reflect nothing but strength along the wholesale way. Demand remains surprisingly good in face of the fact that receipts are increasing and that values have reached an extremely high point.

No change in the local cheese market, was shown for the day aside from the fact that other districts of this section have followed the Tillamook rise but are still considerably below that district's value.

With about 16 carloads of California stock on the tracks today the market for cantaloupes is sharply lower for the day. There are practically no established values, sales being made for similar quality at a wide range.

Great scarcity continues for country-killed hogs in the local market, although values have now reached such a high point that many of the retailers are purchasing "cut" pork from the big packers. Venals are not quite so firm.

Cheerful Meals.
Air, light and sunshine are bestowers of health and cheerfulness. For this reason an effort should be made always to have meals in the brightest room, even if it means having breakfast at the back of the house and dinner at the front. It usually can be managed if the housewife will. ONE MILLION CORDS OF ALASKA PULP SOLD BY THE U. S.

WASHINGTON, July 22.—One million cords of pulpwood on the Tongass National Forest, Alaska, has just been sold by the Forest Service of the United States Department of Agriculture to the Alaskan-American Paper Corporation. The timber is located along the east shore of the Behm Canal, Revillagigedo Island, about 32 miles from Ketchikan, the largest city in the Territory. The contract price of the timber was 60 cents per 100 cubic feet for spruce and cedar, and 30 cents per 100 cubic feet for all other species. The sale area covers 45,000 acres and extends for 55 miles along the coast. Twenty per cent of the forest is spruce, 66 per cent hemlock, and 14 per cent Alaska and western red cedar.

The timber sale contract covers an initial period of 32 years, or until 1953. The price of the stumpage will be redetermined and fixed by the Federal Government in 1928, and every five years thereafter. Cutting must begin by October 1, 1928, thus allowing two years for organization and construction of improvements. The contract also requires the establishment of a pulp mill of not less than 25 tons capacity by October 1, 1928. A yearly cut of from 2,500,000 to 5,000,000 cubic feet is contemplated.
