# BIG FISHING CONTEST IS UNDER WAY

PRIZES ARE TO BE AWARDED  
TO ANGLERS.

Annual Fish Banquet of Wing, Fin and Fleetfoot Club to Follow Monday Night

The streams of Eastern Oregon are being well fished this week-end, the annual fishing contest of the Wing, Fin and Fleetfoot club being the cause of many an angler who goes fishing only once in a while turning out for a day's fishing. Many parties have already left for the streams of Union and Wallawa counties. C. D. Putnam left yesterday but did not tell anyone his destination.

Another party, consisting of William Miller, Robert Newlin and Al Andrews have chosen Troy as their fishing grounds and other parties are on their way to Ice Lake and other haunts of the trout that are not fished every day.

Prizes have been decided on for both trout and bass. Prizes will be awarded on a percentage basis for parties of three, four and five. The party of three delivering a catch of more than 60 per cent of the largest five party catch will receive

first prize. The party of four with 80 per cent of the largest five-party catch will receive first prize. The largest five-party catch over 40 per cent larger than the largest three-party catch and more than 20 per cent larger than the largest four-party catch will receive first prize, second and third prizes being awarded on the same basis.

All members are urged to attend the feed whether they fish or not, but all who can are urged to go fishing and turn in their catches, whether they be large or small, according to announcement by the board of directors. "The appetites of those not going fishing over the week-end are just as good as the rest of us," Al Andrews, secretary of the club, said today, "so we can use all the catches no matter how small."

The prizes to be awarded are as follows: Largest catch of party of four or less, first prize, basket, fishing rod; second prize, book; third prize, spot light; fourth prize, fishing rod; fifth prize, fishing rod; sixth prize, fishing rod; seventh prize, fishing rod; eighth prize, fishing rod; ninth prize, fishing rod; tenth prize, fishing rod.

The big fish banquet is scheduled for Monday evening at the Foley hotel.

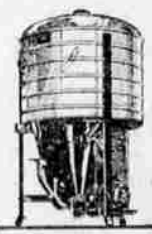
