## State News

(Observer Salem Bureau)  
SALEM, Ore., July 28.—The sixteenth biennial report of the Oregon state board of horticulture is now available for distribution. The volume contains 200 pages and is illustrated with many full-page pictures in addition to many smaller ones that accompany special articles. Charles A. Park, of Salem, is president of the board.

Land acquired by a county or a municipality at tax sale is acquired and held for a corporate purpose and is therefore not subject to taxation while thus held, but upon the sale of such property on contract, or when the land is used for a purpose which affords an income to the municipality holding it, the exemption ceases, according to an opinion of Attorney General Van Winkle, written for the state tax commission.

Oregon's total indebtedness, including all county, city, school, port, irrigation district and drainage district bonds and other obligations is \$107,490,553.84, according to figures compiled by Frank K. Lovell, state tax commissioner.

The month of June marked a new record in the amount of business done by the state corporation department, cash receipts being \$115,000, according to T. B. Handley, corporation commissioner.

The Willamette Valley Southern railway has filed with the public service commission an application to put into effect reduced week-end rates between points on its lines and Portland and Oregon City.

The banking and corporation departments of Oregon have joined in rejecting the application of the Security Savings & Loan association of Reno, Nev., to operate in Oregon as a building and loan association.

The state irrigation securities commission has certified a bond issue of \$11,000 by the Slide irrigation district, covering 14,000 acres on Snake river.

Charles Newton, an inmate of the state hospital for the insane, committed suicide Friday by mounting the window sill of his room and diving head-first to the cement floor, breaking his neck. He died several hours later.

The school population of Lincoln county for the last year was 1321 and for the previous year 1423, according to a report to the state department of education by the Lincoln county superintendent. The county has 70 districts.

J. A. Churchill, state superintendent of schools, has returned from Des Moines, Iowa, where he attended the convention of the National Education association. He also visited his old home at Lima, O.
