## LEGION ELECTS DISTRICT BOARD

Election of a district board which handles all affairs of district interest for the Loyal Legion of Loggers and Lumbermen was one of the last and also one of the most important matters to come before the annual meeting of the Four Ls held here yesterday. The board is a 50-50 proposition composed of an equal number of employees and employers who thresh out the wage scales and other similar problems. This board looks after the interests of the entire district which embraces Umatilla, Union, Wallowa, Grant and Baker counties in Oregon; Adams, Washington, Canyon, Ada, Elmore and Boise counties in Idaho.

The employees elected to the board yesterday afternoon are W. B. Dickens, La Grande; H. B. Larson, Perry; V. O. Wolfe, Emmitt, Idaho; D. J. Durkee, Baker, and C. T. Perkins of Barber, Idaho.

For the employers the board members are: C. A. Barton, Baker; Frank Gardner, Baker; Elmer I. Stoddard, Perry; Vincent Palmer, La Grande, and Joseph Stoddard, of Baker.

Norman F. Coleman, president of all the Four Ls, and W. C. Ruessitz, executive secretary, were here from headquarters in the Alaska Building, Portland. They talked to the men of affairs throughout the 12 districts which embrace all the Northwest.

## Wages Remain as Now
