During the fifty years of their married life, two children were born to them, a son who died in his infancy, and a daughter, Bess, who died a few years ago at the age of 32 years. Thus Mrs. Henry is left alone in the quiet twilight of life when evening shadows cast long silhouettes.

Surrounded by friends, Mrs. Henry is withstanding the shock of her

husbands death remarkably well, and recalled the many struggles the family had in their youth while getting a business start. Ship Goes Down Quickly. EUREKA, Calif., Aug. 8.—Twelve bodies, four identified as passengers

position to assist the authorities in identifying his wife, even though she is there. This afternoon press dispatches indicate that there is but one unidentified body in Eureka, and they do not say if the body is that of a man, woman or child.

and eight as officers and members of the crew, were brought here Sunday out of the 50 passengers and 12 of the crew which were missing to the tide which engulfed the coastwise steamer Alaska at Blunt's reef, 40 miles south of here Saturday night.

Ninety-six passengers and 70 of the crew were brought here Sunday. Twenty-three of the passengers and eight of the crew among the survivors were injured.

Captain Harry Holey, master of the Alaska, and two passengers, were the last on the ship when it sank, about a half hour after it struck. The captain is missing; he was without a

life preserver. One of the two passengers, George Glenn, of Nebraska, was saved.

The steamer Anyox, with the known 186 survivors, arrived here late today. According to the stories of the survivors, the Alaska was proceeding from Portland to San Francisco in a dense fog when about 9:40 o'clock Saturday night it struck one of the rocks of the treacherous Blunt's reef, which projects far into the ocean.

Three lifeboats were launched. The last one was but a few feet from the wreck when the Alaska, which had listed to starboard, suddenly righted and then plunged bow-first.

George Glenn, who with another passenger and the captain were the last men on the ship, came to the surface a short time afterward, and finally found an empty lifeboat.

Others were struggling in the water. The steamer Anyox, towing a barge to Vancouver, was 12 miles distant when the first S. O. S. signals of the Alaska flashed out.

Anyox Reaches Wreck Soon.

Within an hour the Anyox arrived at the wreck and, with order that won high praise from the survivors, the crew of the Anyox speedily picked up those who were drifting in life-preservers or lifeboats.

Through the night other ships joined in the rescue work.

Twelve bodies were found which, with the arrival of the Anyox and a tug bearing the bodies here, left the unaccounted for at 32 passengers and four members of the crew.

Eighteen of the injured passengers

are being cared for in a local hospital, and some passengers and several of the crew injured less seriously were in the hands of the local Red Cross society.

Purser Morgan was severely injured but continued the work of seeing that passengers and crew were cared for. Some of the passengers took the

night train to San Francisco, but the great majority remained here preparing to take a special train, arranged for departure tomorrow by the steamship company agents.
